## Program Revision for Physical Education and Sport Sport Administration Track

### Part II. Description of Curriculum Change

#### 1. Catalog Description

##### Sport Administration Track

##### a. Sport Administration Track – current catalog description

This program prepares students to use a variety of skills to function in a management capacity within the sport industry. Through an array of controlled elective courses, students have the ability to tailor their education to a specific area of interest, e.g., athletic administration, coaching, and sport marketing. Graduates of this program can seek employment in such areas as school and college athletic departments, community recreation organizations, professional sports teams, as well as a host of other athletic and sports related industries. Successful completion of this track of study will also earn the student a minor in business from IUP's Eberly College of Business and Information Technology.

##### b. Sport Administration Track – proposed catalog description

This program track prepares students to use a variety of skills to function in a management capacity within the sport industry. Graduates of this program can seek employment in such areas as school and college athletic departments, coaching, community recreation organizations, minor and major league sports franchises, commercial sport facilities, golf courses, as well as other athletic and sports related industries. Students will acquire management skills that can be used in multiple career tracks. Successful completion of this track of study will also earn the student a Minor in Business from IUP's Eberly College of Business and Information Technology.

3. **Rationale for Changes**

The changes in this track are appropriate for updating the program to best prepare the potential graduates for placement. This track is aligning with the academic guidelines established by the North American Society for Sport Management (NASSM). This track has grown to over 150 undergraduate majors as of fall 2004 and students need current professional preparation.

1. Change Liberal Studies Electives from 9 credits to 6 credits.  
Rationale: Provide credits to match NASSM requirements.
2. Remove HPED 242 Emergency Health Care (1 cr.) from being a requirement.  
Rationale: HPED 175 Prevention and Care of Injuries for the Physically Active is a required course for all tracks/majors within the Physical Education and Sport degree program. There is significant overlap between the 242 and the 175 courses. The HPED 175 course is more comprehensive in that it includes general information related to the prevention and care of a wide range of sports injuries in addition to cardiopulmonary resuscitation. Since all Physical Education and Sport majors must take HPED 175, there is no need to also require HPED 242.

3. Remove HPED 263 Aquatics (1 cr.) and replace with HPED 280 Aquatics Facilities Management (2 cr.).  
Rationale: The track within the Physical Education and Sport programs use different aquatics emphasis to match the recommendations of their professional association. The North American Society of Sport Management (NASSM) sets standards for sport facilities management competencies. This course matches those recommendations.
4. Move HPED 315 Biomechanics from the Core Requirements to the Sport Administration elective choice.  
Rationale: HPED 315 will be treated differently in each of the Physical Education and Sport tracks to allow the track to match the standards published by their individual accreditation agency or curriculum recommendations.
5. Change course title and prerequisites for HPED 344 Adapted Physical Education (3 cr.) with prerequisite of HPED 264 to HPED 344 Adapted Physical Activity and Sport (3 cr.) with a prerequisite of HPED 209 and 221.  
Rationale: This change meets the current terminology in the field and updates the prerequisites to assist student success in the course.
6. Remove prerequisite from HPED 280 Aquatics Facilities Management.  
Rationale: The prerequisite is no longer appropriate for this type of course.
7. Change the title of HPED 335 Coaching and Managing Athletic Programs (3 cr.) to HPED 335 Athletic Coaching (3 cr.).  
Rationale: Course title change reflects the current trends in coaching education.
8. Remove HPED 333 Psychology of Coaching (2 cr.)  
Rationale: The content is covered in HPED 335 Athletic Coaching and HPED 441 Psychosocial Implications of HPE.
9. Add new course, HPED 292 Introduction to Sport Management (3 cr.) to the Sport Administration requirements.  
Rationale: This course will meet some of the recommendations for course content from the North American Society of Sport management (NASSM).
10. Add new course, HPED 320 Managing Facilities and Events in Sport (3 cr.) to the Sport Administration requirements.  
Rationale: This course will meet some of the recommendations for course content from the North American Society of Sport management (NASSM).
11. Add new course, HPED 445 Business Practice in Sport (3 cr.) to the Sport Administration requirements.  
Rationale: This course will meet some of the recommendations for course content from the North American Society of Sport management (NASSM).

12. Add new course, HPED 460 Law and Issues in Sport (2 cr.) to the Sport Administration requirements.  
Rationale: This course will meet some of the recommendations for course content from the North American Society of Sport management (NASSM).
13. Add HPED 493 Internship to the required Sport Administration requirements.  
Rationale: This course will meet some of the recommendations for course content from the North American Society of Sport management (NASSM).
14. Create a 3 credit controlled elective for students to match their career interest with ECON 239 Economics in Sport (3 cr.) as a choice.  
Rationale: This will allow students to match their interest to a course that will benefit their career track.

### **PART III. Implementation**

1. *How will the proposed revision affect students already enrolled in the existing program?*

Students currently enrolled will matriculate through the program and be evaluated for graduation using approved curriculum at the time of the student's initial enrollment at IUP. In cases where courses have been eliminated or replaced with new courses, course substitutions will be issued. There will be no additional requirements imposed on students already accepted into the sport administration program.

2. *Are faculty resources adequate?*

4. *Do you expect an increase or decrease in the number of students as a result of these revisions?*

This track will continue to grow.

### **PART IV. Periodic Assessments**

Individual courses, course content and program curriculum will be evaluated periodically by faculty assigned to teach each course as well as the Health and Physical Education Departmental Undergraduate



Curriculum Committee. This evaluation will include student evaluations of the course and instructor as well as a review of content taught as it applies to College and University Outcome Data and those educational competencies accepted in the professional field of study. As this program strives to receive accreditation by the North American Society for Sport Management (NASSM) course content will match NASSM guidelines.
