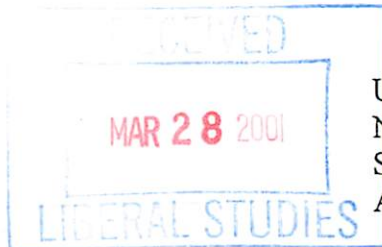

1. The catalog descriptions of the programs will remain the same.
2. Summary
 - a. Table comparing old and new programs (see next page)
 - b. New course PSYC 359 Sensation and Perception added to Area E the Biological Bases of Behavior. PSYC 352, a course on the inactive list, is removed from Area E. PSYC 340, an inactive course, is removed from Area D, Cognition/Learning.
 - c. The addition of the new course to Area E will give the students a wider range of choices. It will also give the department greater flexibility in meeting students' needs in this area.
The removal of PSYC 340 and PSYC 352 results from these courses being placed on the inactive list. Course descriptions of these courses do not appear in the catalog.
