2. Justification/rationale

"Education of the Hearing Impaired" is a currently approved degree program in the Department of Special Education and Clinical Services. In recent years there has been a move away from labels found offensive by certain populations. Both deaf and hard-of-hearing persons have at times expressed displeasure with the term, "hearing impaired," indicating that it stresses the impairment too much. This proposal is to change the name of the program from "Education of the Hearing Impaired" to "Education of Persons with Hearing Loss."

SUMMARY OF CHANGES IN THE EH PROGRAM

The following is a summary of the changes requested in the EH program:

Change in name of program:

Old name: Education of the Hearing Impaired

New name: Education of Persons with Hearing Loss

(Note: The program abbreviation of "EH" will be maintained.)
