2013 Policies and Procedures

COSTS

Program Fees:

- \$1,950 Double Room:
 - includes bed and breakfast seven days a week,
 - includes a 3-course evening meal (Monday - Friday) at St. Edmund Hall, Oxford.
- \$2,050 Single Room * (includes same considerations listed above).

**Depends upon availability. If single room is not available, the \$100 difference will be refunded.*

Optional Educational Excursions:

There are a limited number of seats available, so book early if you plan on participating in excursions. The cost of the excursion(s) is **non-refundable** and **non-transferable**. In other words, if you decide later not to participate in an excursion, you are not permitted to sell your seat, nor will you be refunded your payment for the excursion. We will be filling any unoccupied seats from a waiting list.

- \$55.00 Excursion Friday, July 19
Stonehenge and Bath (includes entry into Stonehenge and Roman Baths)
- \$ 55.00 Excursion Tuesday, July 23
Warwick Castle and Stratford (Includes entry into WarwickCastle.)

One of the most popular aspects of the Oxford program, the two one-day tours offer students an opportunity to visit historically important sites from different eras of English history. They were selected for general interest and to illustrate some of the long panorama of British history. By participating in both, you can visit Britain of prehistoric, Roman, Medieval, and present times.

- \$35.00 Afternoon Trip to Blenheim Palace and Gardens

If students are interested, we may also organize an afternoon trip out to Blenheim Palace one day. In addition to being the home of the Duke of Marlborough for many years, Blenheim was the birthplace of Sir Winston Churchill who was Prime Minister of Britain during World War II. There is a terrific display about Churchill's life and work there as well as a wonderful historical display about George C. Marshall and the Marshall Plan for the recovery of Post-War Europe. In addition to the fantastic interiors of the palace, those who stroll about the gardens will be amazed at their symmetry and the natural beauty that persists from the time of their design by the famous architect Capability Brown.

Tuition:

Students must contact the institution of his/her professor to arrange tuition and credit. **Each professor** sees that students are properly registered and is responsible for transferring credit to the student's university. Tuition is determined by what the **professor's institution** charges.

Air Travel:

Air travel to London must be arranged independently. When you have booked your flight, fill out and return the Travel Information Form (last page of the packet) to Dr. Lynne Alvine, no Later than June 15, 2013.

For those who would like to travel with others in the program, I will have one flight itinerary designated as the "**group flight**." Some of the professors will be on that flight. In order to book a ticket, go to the USAirways website at <http://usairways.com> The flights that I have designated as the 'group flight' are as follows: USAirways, departing on **July 12, 2013** departing from either Pittsburgh or Philadelphia and returning **August 3, 2013**.

(Note: The arrival in England will be on Saturday, July 13.)

Airfares on the date of this writing (October 31, 2012) are as follows:

Pittsburgh \$1,191 *Philadelphia: \$1,466 (Include taxes and fees.)

(These airfares are likely to be similar to those you will find on your own; however, you may want to check out lots of options. Who knows why the same flight costs more if you originate in Philly??)

Ground Transportation

The Oxford Bus Company operates a very convenient coach service from Heathrow to Oxford. You will need to purchase a 'period return' ticket for 25 GBP or about \$45. This ticket will cover your transfer from Heathrow to Oxford on July 13 and back to the airport again on August 3. You can buy this ticket at the airport, but will need British Pounds. Plan to use an ATM at the airport.

If you arrange for another flight other than the ones listed above, you should plan to arrive at Heathrow Airport between 9 AM and 10 AM on July 13, 2013, if you want to travel to Oxford with the group. Your return flight from Heathrow should not leave before 10 am on August 3. You may, of course, travel to Oxford on your own if you arrive at a different time.

Remember, regardless of what flight you choose, you will need to plan for about \$45 in round trip ground transportation costs from the airport to Oxford.

Other Expenses:

Spending Money

I am sometimes asked: "How much money shall I bring?" You will need to buy lunch every day and lunch and supper on Saturdays and Sundays. Oxford is a popular tourist destination and offers a wide range of prices and facilities. You could plan on about \$10.00 for a very simple lunch during the week, and about \$50.00 a day for the 5 weekend days you'll be in England. That's about \$360.00 for the 3-week stay for minimum comfort.

A round-trip coach ticket to London costs about \$25 to \$30. Most students go several times to see the sights, the museums, and theaters. The coach leaves every 20 minutes for the 1½ -hour trip from a bus stop that is about 100 feet from St. Edmund Hall where you will be staying.

These trips and others, plus tickets for concerts and plays in Oxford while we are there, are an option for everyone. Then, of course, there are the souvenirs and sweatshirts and gifts to buy. Including the \$360.00 predicted minimum needed for lunch and the weekend meals, \$900 would be the suggested absolute minimum amount of spending money needed. Some students spend more, of course; some spend a great deal more! It is really a combination of interests and budgets. (We've never heard anyone complain that they had too much money to spend!)

VISA and MASTERCARD are accepted at many shops, hotels, many restaurants, and travel agencies, though you will **pay a surcharge** for use of the card. You may find using these cards to be safe, efficient, and financially advantageous. You will also need cash for daily incidentals, snacks, bus fares, etc. ATM machines are readily accessible in the U.K. (An ATM card is the most convenient way of getting cash in England.) Please check prior to departure the services available and fees charged with use of both your credit and ATM cards. Due to stricter anti-fraud efforts, many cards will not work unless you have registered your trip with the card service. Call the company and/or bank and let them know of your travel plans. Traveler's checks are no longer widely accepted. **I do not recommend buying traveler's checks.**

Students are encouraged NOT to plan travel outside the British Isles during the IUP Oxford program; **doing so will significantly increase the cost of participating in this study abroad program.** There are so many wonderful sites to see in Oxford and London! Take advantage of having a place to stay while there, rather than running off to spend a very short time in another country. Travel to other places before and after the program dates is an option, of course, if your funds permit.

PROGRAM DEADLINES

- \$100 Program Deposit **Due with Application** – Please apply by late February, if possible. (This deposit is applied to your total program fee.)
- Optional Educational Excursion Fees should be paid **as soon as possible** and prior to April 1; if no seats are available, you will be placed on a waiting list.
- **June 1, 2013** Program Fee Balance Due: If you face a delay due to the processing of student loans, or for any reason, **please inform me, I will work with you and the IUP Bursar's Office.**
- Check with your professor to find out when your tuition is due, as each institution may have a different **tuition due date**. Be sure to register for the course in a timely manner. Registration usually generates a bill for tuition.
- Check with your professor to learn what flight he or she may be taking. If you have concerns about flying alone, please coordinate your travel with your professor or others in the program.

We will continue to accept participants as long as rooms in Oxford are available. Typically we like to take about 40 students total, but this year we hope to have a few more, since we have more courses from which to choose. Please contact me if you have any questions.

Refund Policy: Program Fee and Excursion:

Cancellation policy for participants is:

- **Before May 1** Professors are to cancel any class that does not 'make.' Students may take a different course if they choose to do so. **Professors please let students know if you are considering cancelling, since they may want to wait to book airfare.**
- **Before May 1** - Full refund of Program Fee
- **Between May 1 and June 1** - Refund of Program Fee, less \$100.00
- **After June 1** - No refund of Program Fee for any reason
- Cancellation must be made in writing and postmarked no later than **June 1, 2013**
- There is NO refund at any time for the Educational Excursions and ground transportation fees.

Courses:

This page contains an annotated list of courses available. Participants may register for only **ONE** course. Please note that if, for any reason, the course you want to take is cancelled by May 1, you may enroll in a different course. No one is allowed to change the course selected after July 1.

ENGL 434: Shakespeare

This course will focus on five plays of Shakespeare, including their texts, film adaptations, and live performances. The plays selected will be ones that are in performance at the Globe Theater in London, the RSC Theater in Stratford and/or in the colleges of Oxford in summer 2010. Prior to traveling to England students will have read the texts of selected plays. Students will discuss those plays and attend performances of the plays as they are available in Oxford, London, and/or Stratford. Film adaptations may also be viewed and discussed. (Students in this class will need about \$100 for play tickets.) Graduate students who may take the course for independent study will complete an appropriate research project. (Undergraduate/Graduate IUP)

JRNL 223/801: Photojournalism

This course will give students an opportunity to take digital pictures of people engaged in their everyday activities, including pictures of community meetings, sports events, architectural and historic sites as well as in entertainment venues. Creativity and innovation in taking pictures that tell a story will be the key feature in the course. (Undergraduate, IUP)

ENGL 481/581: Literature for Young Readers in the British Tradition

This course will focus on both classic and contemporary literary texts for adolescents, including the writings of C.S. Lewis, J.R.R. Tolkein, Lewis Carroll, and J.K. Rowling. Additional contemporary works of YA literature will be explored and discussed. Paramount will be the texts written and/or set in and around Oxford, U.K. (Undergraduate/Graduate, IUP)

NUR 82.310: Family Nursing

This course focuses on the concept of family as an open system and the use of the nursing process to access and promote family health across its lifespan. Students analyze the structures and functions of the family in contemporary U.S. society as a basis for determining health care needs. The role of the environment and socio-cultural factors are explored as they influence the family's various functions. (Undergraduate, BU)

POLS 322: Comparative European Government

This course is a study of major types of government with the emphasis on European democracies: comparison is used as a detector of problems and as a method for developing better solutions; differences in character, traditions, and conditions are examined to develop an understanding of problems facing people of respective countries. (Undergraduate, ESU)

Family members and friends of study abroad students may apply to be 'Independent Scholars' and be included as participants in the Program. All requirements are the same as for students taking courses, including fees and policies.

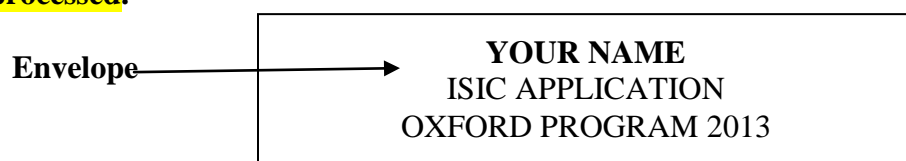
Individuals making travel arrangements should plan to secure their ground transportation to and from the airport. There is also no need to reserve this coach ticket in advance.

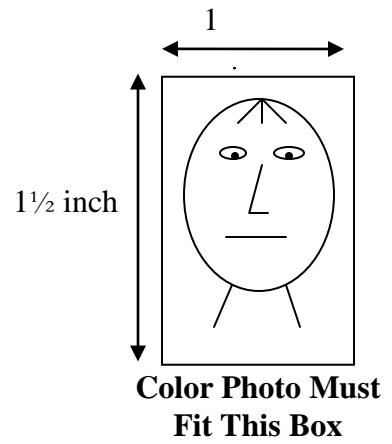
