## ADDENDUM TO THE CHECKLISTS in effect as of spring 2011 for the B.A. in Spanish, and the B.S. Spanish Education K-12 (and for the B.A. in Spanish for International Trade, which is not accepting new students after fall 2011)

## **Prerequisites (check carefully):**

SPAN 201 or equivalent for SPAN 220/222/223 and SPAN 290

SPAN 220 (222/223) for SPAN 230 OR 220/222/223 and 230 may be taken concurrently

SPAN 230 for SPAN 260, 350, 340, 342, 344, 354, 382-389 (Valladolid), 400, 402, 403, 404, 453

SPAN 230 and SPAN 350 for SPAN 402

SPAN 260 or SPAN 385 (Valladolid) for SPAN 362, 364, 410-431

SPAN 350 for SPAN 450

## Study at other institutions and abroad

Students may study at other institutions (U.S. and abroad) during their years at IUP. In many cases, courses from other institutions can substitute for IUP courses. It is the student's responsibility to consult with his/her advisor in a timely manner in order to review the applicability of the proposed program of studies. The student must then complete a pre-approval form in consultation with the Transfer Credit Office. Final approval is contingent not only upon Transfer Credit Office acceptance but also compliance with IUP Spanish Department program policies.

In general, a student who participates in the IUP-Mexico program will earn 6 credits. The distribution of those credits depends on what the student takes in Mexico. The possible combinations are these:

- 3 credits from Spanish 244, and 3 transfer credits counted as either SPAN 220 or 350.
- 3 credits from Spanish 244, 3 transfer credits to substitute for an approved 300-level course.
- A student MAY earn credit for SPAN 201 (4 credits) and SPAN 220, but ONLY if they are at the appropriate level AND have been granted permission by the program director. A student who earns credit for SPAN 201 and 220 while participating in the Cuernavaca, Mexico program will then earn 7 credits on the program rather than 6.

<u>Please note:</u> A student may not receive credit for SPAN 350 via participation in the IUP Costa Rica program unless he or she has already received credit for SPAN 220 and SPAN 230. A student can receive credit for SPAN 350 via participation in the IUP-Mexico program if he or she has received credit for SPAN 220, whether or not he or she has already received credit for SPAN 230.
