

Biotechnology Summer Camp – High School Students 2013 Information Sheet

Application and Payment: A check for the full payment must accompany your application form. Make checks payable to the IUP Research Institute. You may also pay by Visa or MasterCard by phoning the IUP Research Institute at 724-357-2223.

Class Hours Monday-Friday: 9:00 am - 12:00 pm (lecture series) 1:00 pm - 4:00 pm (laboratory)

Class size: 24 students' maximum each session

Supervision: All students will be escorted during breakfast, lunch, and dinner and will be supervised at all times on the campus. This includes the dormitory, library, computer facilities, laboratory, gymnasium, etc. Students staying in the residential hall will be supervised at all times during their stay.

Housing:

- Residential students will be staying in the residential hall on the Indiana University of Pennsylvania campus from July 7-13, 2013 (Sunday-Saturday); residential staff is available at all times. Students may be dismissed for weekends with prior written consent/permission. Valid photo I.D. is required for pick up.
- A multifaceted security system is in place in all residential buildings on campus. The four main features of the system are: university I-Card/building access, exterior door alarms, building lock-up times, and video surveillance cameras.
- Residential students will receive a university temporary I-Card while staying at IUP. The I-Card gives students access to the residential hall. The I-Card will be programmed so that it can be swiped through the card reader(s) at the residential hall to allow access. The I-Card is programmed for use at the residential hall only and will not work in any readers in any other building on campus. Instructions on how to use the I-Card are posted near each reader. Housing assignments are based on gender and age. Students who cause damage to their rooms or the common areas or who lose their temporary I-Card will be subject to additional fees.
