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OUTREACH activities

One of the goals of the Allegheny Arboretum is to develop outreach activities with the community. The following is a list of these activities.

- Cooperated with the Indiana County Parks to map and mount information plaques on each of the 18 different tree species in Memorial Park. Donated a sugar maple (*Acer saccharum*) to replace a removed tree.
- In cooperation with the Horace Mann Outdoor Committee, purchased tree plaques for the six different tree species planted at Horace Mann Elementary School.
- In cooperation with the Indiana Free Library, sponsored a "story walk" in the Oak Grove during Homecoming.
- Donated five oak trees to Indiana's Mack Park.
- Members of Club Scout Pack 29 in Indiana have helped to plant trees within the community and at IUP.
- Worked with the Evergreen Garden Club of Indiana to replace the demolished Touch and Smell Garden with the Heritage Garden.
- With support from the University Museum, the Evergreen Garden Club, and the Indiana Garden Club, sponsored a three-week museum exhibition. The show featured prints, drawings, and watercolors from the collection of the Hunt Institute of Botanical Documentation at Carnegie Mellon University.

tree plantings: In the last year, 32 trees were planted on campus. Eleven of the trees were planted in the Oak Grove. Dedicated trees have been listed. Some of the trees were “replants,” because of the death of the original dedicated trees. Some of the trees planted were based on the recommendations of the Campus Heritage Preservation Plan.

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STUDENT PROJECT: Christopher Juengel, from the Communications Media Department, had his Electronic Imaging class create posters that could be used for marketing the arboretum. This is the seventh year that students have participated in such activities.

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tree inventory and management plan:

This summer, Bartlett Tree Experts completed a Tree Inventory and Management Plan for the IUP campus. The inventory provided information on plant quantities, location, condition, size, and maintenance requirements. Based on this information, a sustainable management plan and budget can be developed.

Global positioning systems (GPS) and geographical information systems (GIS) were utilized in the study. Information about trees 6" in diameter and larger was collected. A numbered tag was placed on each of the 795 trees inventoried. The total value of those trees was determined to be \$4,387,000. It is planned that some of this information will be available electronically in the near future.

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ARBNET: The Allegheny Arboretum became registered with ArbNet, a free, interactive community that supports professional exchange and collaboration for arboreta. The Morton Arboretum, in cooperation with the American Public Gardens Association and Botanic Gardens Conservation International, coordinates the Morton Register and the accreditation program. The accreditation program provides standards for the establishment and development of an official arboretum. Four levels of accreditation recognize arboreta of various degrees of development, capacity, and professionalism.

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BOARD CHANGES: The following changes occurred in the Allegheny Arboretum Board membership.

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MEMORIAL STONE:

A memorial steppingstone was placed in the Heritage Garden in honor of Kipp Seelhorst, a religious studies student who died in 2012. His family and friends established a fund through the Foundation for IUP to promote a lecture series and scholarship that are consonant with the dedication to religious understanding and the spirit of adventure that was so much a part of his character.



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UPDATE: EMERALD ASH BORER

As was reported in last year's annual report, several of the ash trees in the Oak Grove showed signs of infestation. All of the trees were treated to try to control the EAB. Unfortunately, two of the trees had to be removed this summer. The wood has been saved and is being stored at the drying building, waiting to be cut into planks for use by the Center of Turning and Furniture Design. Hopefully, the remaining ash trees can be saved.



PLANTING RECOMMENDATIONS:



As part of efforts to cooperate with IUP, the Design Review Committee made recommendations on the tree plantings surrounding the new College of Humanities and Social Sciences building. Construction is expected to be complete in the fall of 2015. In addition, the committee will make recommendations for plantings in the proposed Creative Arts Plaza, also to be completed in the fall of 2015.



NO - MOW ZONE update:

Following a program implemented by the Pennsylvania State Parks system, a no-mow zone was created on the South Campus. The development of such zones saves energy, reduces labor, reduces water flow, and increases biodiversity. The site is showing the early stages of plant succession, and the planted river birch trees (*Betula nigra*) are growing well in the zone. Because of its success last year, the size of the zone was increased.

6. Continue to evaluate and revise the Allegheny Arboretum website.
7. Continue to work with administrators, faculty members, and students at IUP to promote Allegheny Arboretum-related projects.
8. Continue to cultivate contacts with local organizations.
9. Continue to develop ways to market the Allegheny Arboretum.
10. Continue to implement the goals and objectives of the Allegheny Arboretum.

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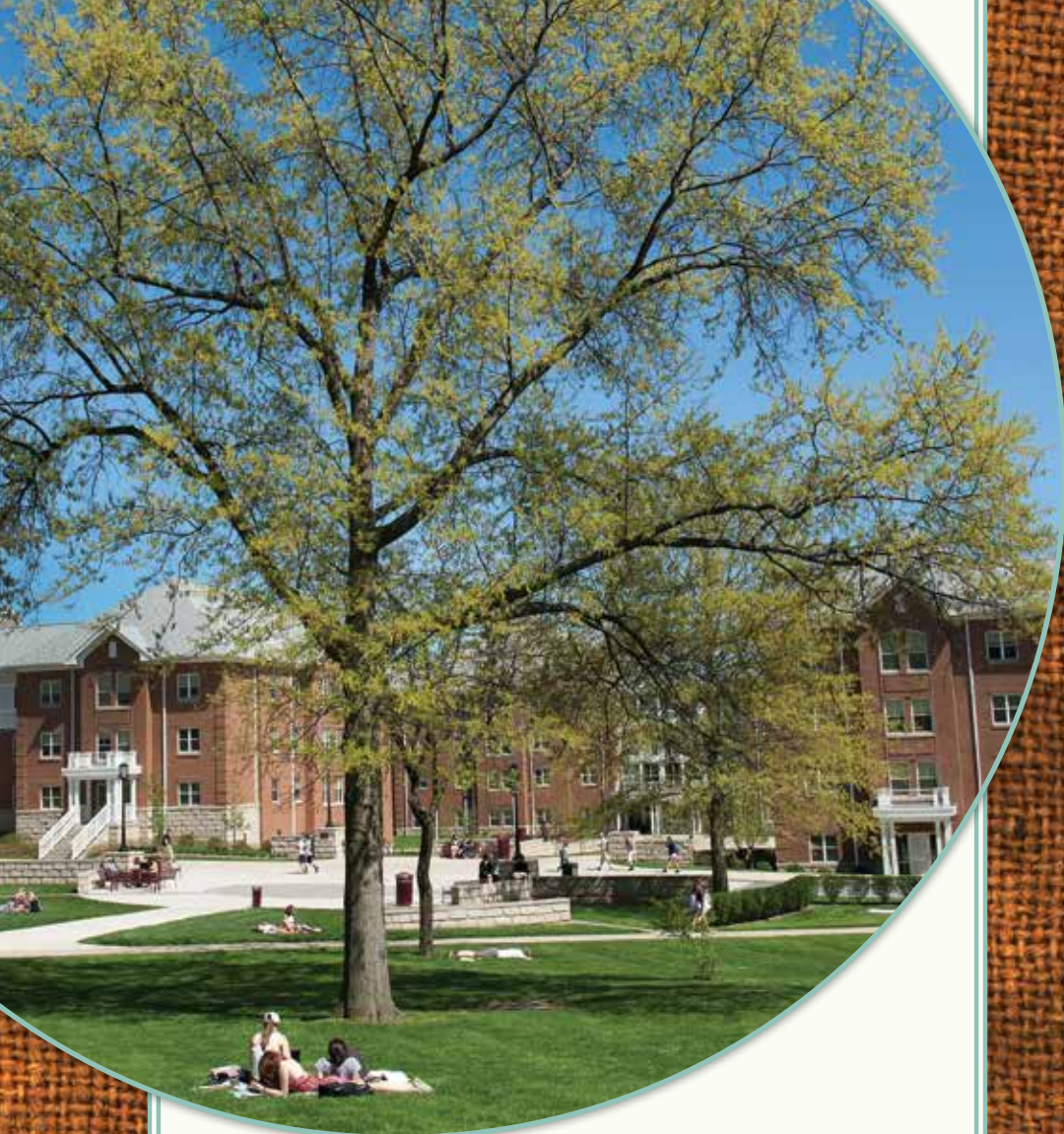
