

The Mission of the IUP Research Institute is to advance the research agenda and educational objectives of Indiana University of Pennsylvania. The Research Institute provides a full range of pre-award and post-award services designed to provide support for IUP researchers. The Research Institute is governed by an independent Board of Directors which is responsible for upholding the Institute's Articles of Incorporation, By-Laws, and the principles set forth in the Affiliation Agreement with the University. The Board is composed of appointed University representatives and local community business leaders.


Indiana University of Pennsylvania and the IUP Research Institute jointly administer external funds. The IUP Research Institute is a 501c (3) (tax exempt) organization that operates independently for the benefit of Indiana University of Pennsylvania, under the terms of the Affiliation Agreement.

This Annual Report of Externally Sponsored Activities summarizes externally funded grants, contracts, and cooperative agreements for the year of **July 1**, **2020** – **June 30**, **2021** (Fiscal Year 2020-2021). This report is designed to recognize IUP faculty and staff members who dedicate their time, talents, and expertise to seek and receive external funds for their research, teaching, and creative activities. These accomplishments represent the outstanding commitment on the part of faculty and staff to advance the research, teaching, and public service missions of the University through external funding.


This report is sectioned by award data, expenditure data, and proposal data. Note that expense data transcends multiple fiscal years and is dependent upon the period of performance and spend plans of each individual grant project. Many times, even with effective post-award management, activities actually performed differ from activities planned at the proposal stage. Changes in activities often result in modifications to the budget and expenses incurred. When these changes occur, the dollar amounts actually expensed can differ from the award expectations. In the case of cost-reimbursable grants (large majority), the dollar amounts actually expensed and received by the institution could be less than what was awarded by the funding agency (at least in the time frame covered by this report). In addition, award dollars are not currently 'split' by or among co-investigator(s). Therefore, the department/unit of co-investigators are not recognized in this particular report. Alternate reports are available upon request.

## IUP Sponsored Activity Awards: 2-year comparison FY2019 – 2020 to FY2020 - 2021




# Awards by Originating Funding Source Fiscal Year 2020 - 2021



IUP received 59% of its award dollars from the federal government (\$5,563,413), with the U.S. Department of Labor ranking as the top federal funder at \$1,951,200. The U.S. Department of Education came in second at \$1,264,516. The federal and state agencies combined (\$7,937,364) account for 85% of IUP's externally sponsored funding in FY2021.




FEDERAL AWARDS



## Awards by Academic Department FY2019-FY2020 to FY2020-FY2021




## Awards by Academic Department FY2019-2020 to FY2020-2021



The College of Fine Arts brought in a total of \$189,925 in FY2021. This is an increase of \$86,090 over FY1920. Congratulations College of Fine Arts!




## <u>College of Health & Human Services</u> Awards by Academic Department FY2019 to FY2020-2021


## College of Humanities & Social Sciences Awards by Academic Department FY2019-2020 to FY2020-2021



The College of Humanities & Social Sciences brought in a total of \$871,097 in FY2021. Congratulations to the College of Humanities & Social Sciences!




## Kopchick College of Natural Sciences and Mathematics Awards by Academic Department FY2019-2020 to FY2020-2021

#### Proposal & Award Strategies, Compliance Efforts,

#### and Continuous Improvement

The RI works diligently to ensure proposals submitted are of the highest possible quality. Adhering to standard operating procedures helps to ensure the technical and budget narratives meet agency guidelines, meet applicable federal, state, and university pre-requisites, require reasonable university support, budget and scope of work are consistent, and have been appropriately reviewed, analyzed, and authorized by all IUP and IUPRI administrative entities.

When appropriate (and as time permits), the School of Graduate Studies and Research (SGSR) provides an in-depth review/edit of proposal narratives to help ensure the highest possible quality. For "significant projects," professional external reviewers are utilized and paid for by the SGSR. These efforts have greatly improved the quality of our proposals and the grant-writing expertise of our researchers. It is fully expected that we will see a long-term return on investment as these researchers continue to grow and succeed in grantsmanship activities.

To promote post-award success, upon award receipt, the RI facilitates a "kick-off" meeting with the Principal Investigator to discuss and review the mechanics of how to efficiently execute the scope of work. Compliance with federal, state, and university policies and regulations are emphasized. These meetings may include members from administration, grants accounting, purchasing, human resources, and any other areas pertinent to successful outcomes. These "kick-off" meetings assist the researcher in understanding basic requirements such as purchasing equipment, grant-funded graduate assistantships, and processing summer compensation or academic year releases.

Staying up-to-date with federal, state, and other agency compliance requirements for sponsored activities is one of the most important responsibilities of the RI. To assist IUP in this function, the RI requires staff to participate in at least one professional organization conference per year. Partnering with the SGSR, the RI assisted in establishing standard operating procedures in areas such as technology transfer, research misconduct, intellectual property, and other related areas.

The Research Institute team is committed to continuous improvements to ensure researchers receive the most efficient and compliant assistance with their research endeavors. Policies, procedures, and workflow are under continual review and are modified as needed to accommodate changes to the Uniform Guidance and best practice initiatives.




