

Sexual assault is a serious violation of the university's expectations and student behavioral regulations. The university recognizes that sexual assault may cause severe physical and/or emotional consequences for the victim. Medical and mental health resources and preventive education are available to provide assistance.

Please note provided emergency and support contact information.

Medical Attention: The victim should be referred to the nearest hospital if the alleged assault occurred within the last seventy-two hours. Evidence can be gathered to conduct medical-legal (forensic) examinations even if the victim prefers not to prosecute at this time. An Indiana Campus student can also be referred to IUP Health Service at 724-357-2550. If the alleged assault occurred more than seventy-two hours previously, the victim should be referred to the nearest hospital for medical care only. No evidence collection can occur. If Health Service is closed, refer the student to the Emergency Department of the nearest hospital. This step is important so that they receives proper assessment and treatment of any physical injuries sustained in the alleged assault. It is also important to determine the victim's risk of sexually transmitted diseases or pregnancy and take preventive measures.

Requesting Academic, Living, Transportation, and Work Accommodations: Victims can request accommodations if their safety or well-being is at risk. Students can receive assistance in requesting accommodations from the IUP Haven Project at 724-357-3947. Examples of accommodations include changing academic schedules or on-campus housing assignments, use of IUP's escort system, and adjustments to work assignments. Please refer to the Haven Project's "**Survivor Handbook**" for guidance on these and all other aspects of support for sexual assault, sexual violence, or stalking.

Campus Security Authorities:

In general, Campus Security Authorities (CSA's) are individuals or organizations of an institution of higher education that, by virtue of their job or position function, are required to report crimes that have been brought to their attention. Reporting and Investigating:

Call University Police at 724-357-2141.

University Police will assist the victim in reporting and refer them to the appropriate office for follow-up through the legal and/or university student conduct system. In cases requiring immediate attention or assistance off campus, victims should contact 911.

Ensure that the victim is in a safe and secure environment and encourage them to preserve all physical evidence. When reporting the alleged assault to university police, the victim relinquishes the right to decide if legal and/or university disciplinary action will be taken against the person who allegedly perpetrated the assault.
