*The Level II Studio course must be successfully completed before a student will be permitted to enroll in an advanced studio. Students must complete 3 credits within an advanced studio before permission will be granted to enroll in the 6 credit advanced level course. Permission of the instructor is a prerequisite to all 6 credit advanced studios.*

*Inclusion of internship (ART 493) credits toward any portion of fulfillment of degree requirements must be approved by the departmental chair and student's major advisor. Approval must be obtained in writing prior to enrollment.*
