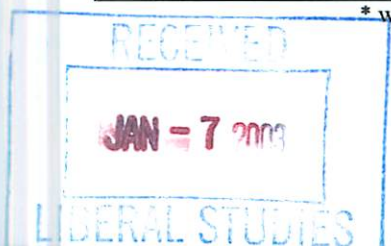

Subject: Curriculum revision

The Psychology Department Undergraduate Curriculum Committee reviewed the department's current set of Liberal Studies requirements to make recommendations regarding our compliance with the mandated shift from 124 to 120 credits for graduation. Based on the committee's recommendation, the Psychology Department voted to remove COSC/BTED/IFMG 101 as a required Liberal Studies elective. There were two primary reasons behind this decision: First, our incoming students are much more computer literate than was the case when the requirement was instituted. Second, our original hope was that students would be able to take the computer course before they enrolled - mostly as sophomores - in PSYC 290: Research Design and Analysis I. PSYC 290 involves students in computer-based word-processing, statistical analysis, and database use, i.e., in those areas where computers are most often used in psychology. Because of scheduling difficulties, many of our students are not able to schedule this course until their junior or senior years. Given this and their higher initial literacy, COSC/IFMG/BTED 101 no longer serves the purpose for which the initial requirement was intended.

Mary Lou,

On behalf of the Computer Science Department, I want to express our disappointment with your decision to no longer require Microbased Computer Literacy. We would expect that Psychology students would have specific needs for the spreadsheet and database components of the course. We would think that the data analysis and information processing needed in the field of Psychology would require graduates to use and create both spreadsheets and databases.

Our surveys and the exemption exam for the Microbased Computer Literacy course have revealed that although students often have some knowledge of wordprocessing from High School, they have little knowledge of spreadsheets and almost no knowledge of databases. We would presume that some courses you teach would require your students to make use of these information processing mechanisms. Hopefully, you have found some alternative way of addressing these needs.

I can't think of any way for Computer Science to address the scheduling difficulties that your describe. Historically, we have offered as many sections of COSC 101 as we could and at as varied times as possible.
