2. The current dietetics curriculum identified by the American Dietetic Association as Plan IV is to be deleted and replaced with the proposed dietetics curriculum.

Justification: Certification of the College of Human Ecology by the American Home Economics Association has been eliminated. HE 218 is proposed as one of two courses that can be selected as a liberal studies elective in the proposed curriculum.


