The Campus Sexual Assault Victim's Bill of Rights requires all colleges and universities (both public and private) participating in federal student aid programs afford sexual assault victims certain basic rights. Complaints about schools that have failed to comply with this law should be made to the U.S. Department of Education. The "Campus Sexual Assault Victim's Bill of Rights" exists as a part of the campus security reporting requirements, commonly known as the Jeanne Clery Act.

Title IX of the Educational Amendments of 1972 prohibits discrimination based on sex. Sexual harassment of students, which includes acts of sexual violence, is a form of sex discrimination prohibited by this federal law. When incidents of sexual harassment or sexual violence, including domestic violence, stalking, and dating violence, occur and are reported to campus security authorities, IUP takes immediate and effective steps to end sexual harassment and sexual violence. Retaliation against individuals reporting sexual harassment and/or sexual violence will not be tolerated and will be addressed through the appropriate university process (University Police, Student Conduct, Human Resources).
