

Sexual assault and sexual violence may cause severe physical and/or emotional consequences for the victim. Medical and mental health resources are available to provide assistance.

Please note “Where to Turn for Help” information on reverse side.

Immediate Medical Attention: The victim should be referred to the nearest hospital if the assault occurred within the last seventy-two hours. Evidence can be gathered to conduct medical-legal (forensic) examinations, even if the victim prefers not to prosecute at the time. (An Indiana Campus student can also be referred to IUP Health Service at 724-357-2550.) This step is important so that they receive proper assessment and treatment of any physical injuries sustained in the assault. It is also important to determine the victim’s risk of sexually transmitted diseases or pregnancy and take preventive measures.

Requesting Academic, Living, Transportation, and Work Accommodations: Victims can request accommodations if their safety or well-being is at risk by contacting the Title IX Coordinator or the IUP Haven Project (724-357-3947). Examples of accommodations include changing academic schedules or on-campus housing assignments, use of IUP’s escort system, and adjustments to work assignments. Reporting:

All members of the university community who suspect or allege that a sexual misconduct violation has been committed can report the incident to University Police or the Title IX Coordinator.

Prompt reporting is critical in instances where sexual violence or sexual assault are suspected or alleged. **Call University Police at 724-357-2141.** University Police will assist in reporting and referral to the appropriate office for follow-up through the legal and/or university student conduct system. **In cases requiring immediate attention or assistance off campus, call 911.** Ensure that the person is in a safe and secure environment and encourage them to preserve all physical evidence.

Title IX of the Educational Amendments of 1972 is a federal law that prohibits discrimination, harassment, and violence on the basis of sex in any federally funded education program or activity. IUP will address acts of discrimination or misconduct by educating the members of its community, identifying clear reporting requirements, investigating all alleged violations of policy and, as appropriate, disciplining members of the community found in violation.

Incidents of sexual harassment and sexual violence, including sexual assault, sexual exploitation, dating violence, domestic violence, and stalking should be reported immediately. Retaliation against individuals reporting will not be tolerated and will be addressed through the appropriate university process.
