

## An Eight Semester Sequence for English Education

To All Undergraduate English Education Majors: To make the most of your four years at IUP, you need to know when to take your courses because some requirements—especially those for teacher certification in the state of Pennsylvania as well as the Liberal Studies science requirement, the math requirement, and the language requirement—can be confusing.

To help you visualize an efficient sequence of courses, we show (below, left) two options or paths for completing the program in four years, depending on which way you decide to fulfill the science requirement. One way is the Preferred Option (shown at left) and involves taking two lab science courses to fulfill the Liberal Studies science requirement. This option is preferred because it involves fewer credits and no overloads when compared to the Other Option, and it can be completed with 120 credit hours.

Another way (below, right) involves taking 3 science courses: 2 non-lab courses plus 1 lab course. Because of the additional science credits involved in the Other Option, you may have to take more credits later on.

With either option, you may have more flexibility than is shown below if your language requirement is waived or if you opt to take summer classes. If you have any exemption for your foreign language requirement, then you will need to take those credits as free electives.
