**ACADEMIC HONESTY IN DETAIL  
(To be reviewed with students at Freshman and Transfer Student Orientation)**

A student may not:

- provide or receive unauthorized assistance in coursework (as stipulated in the university's Academic Integrity Policy and Procedures, II.A.1).<sup>1</sup>
- use unauthorized materials or devices, such as crib notes, during examinations or quizzes.<sup>1</sup>
- plagiarize academic work (as stipulated in the university's Academic Integrity Policy and Procedures, II.A.3).<sup>1</sup>
- use the same paper or work more than once without explicit permission of the faculty member to whom the work is being submitted.<sup>1</sup>
- possess course examination materials before the administration of the exam, without the prior knowledge or consent of the instructor.<sup>1</sup>
- intentionally evade IUP academic policies and procedures (as stipulated in the university's Academic Integrity Policy and Procedures, II.A.6).<sup>1</sup>
- falsify information, including falsification/fabrication of research data and/or statistical analyses, forge signatures on various forms and documents, or alter or add answers on academic exercises or exams after work has been graded.<sup>1</sup>
- engage in computer dishonesty (as stipulated in the university's Academic Integrity Policy and Procedures, II.A.8.).<sup>1</sup>
- engage in acts of noncompliance (as stipulated in the university's Academic Integrity Policy and Procedures, II.A.9).<sup>1</sup>
- engage in class behavior which significantly disrupts the learning process or is a threat to others.<sup>1</sup>
- buy, sell, steal, or engage in unauthorized exchange of, or improperly use, any assignments, papers, or projects.<sup>1</sup>
- make fraudulent claims to gain academic credit or to influence testing or grading.<sup>1</sup>
- download, possess or share works<sup>2</sup> or inventions<sup>3</sup> ("intellectual property") without the permission of the copyright holder or creator.

<sup>3</sup> includes any discovery, invention, process, composition of matter, article of manufacture, know-how, design, model, technological development, biological material, strain, variety, culture of any organism, or portion, modification, translation, or extension of these items, and any mark used in connection with these items.
