LET'S TALK ABOUT PERIOD POVERTY

Period poverty refers to the lack of access to menstrual products, sanitation facilities, and education. It leads to using inadequate substitutes like toilet paper, socks, or staying home due to lack of products. This can cause health issues, impact education and work, and perpetuate poverty.

Pid you know...

- Menstruation is costly; several studies have estimated the "cost of being a menstruator" at \$20,000 over a lifetime.
- 2 in 5 menstruators struggle to purchase period products due to lack of income.
- Survey research showed that in the Pittsburgh region, 26% were unable to access period supplies each month, and 60% of menstruators had to use something other than a period product.
- One-third of low income menstruators report missing work, school, or similar commitments due to lack of access to period supplies.
