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Dr. B Gail Wilson

Dr. B. Gail Wilson grew up on a farm in northern Kentucky, where her family grew tobacco and raised beef cattle. She attended Morehead State University where she received her bachelor 's degree in Radio and Television. After graduation she was hired by MSU to work at the university 's radio station, WMKY-FM, a 50,000 watt NPR affiliated public radio station. She continued her education at Morehead State University, where she received a Master 's Degree in Communications and Journalism. Dr. Wilson was the first in her family to receive her Doctorate which she earned at the University of Pittsburgh and graduated in 1992.

Dr. Wilson began teaching at Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 1986 as an Instructor of Communications Media. As her education and experience teaching increased she was promoted from Assistant Professor to Associate Professor and now is a Professor in the Communications Media Department.

Dr. Wilson teaches many classes including Broadcast Newswriting, Scriptwriting, Media Presentation Skills, Promotion for Radio, TV, and Cable, and Senior Portfolio Presentation. There are also numerable other classes that she has taught in her 20 years at IUP making her a very popular teacher with the Communications Media students.





However, when she is not holding class or grading papers, you can usually find her outdoors. Dr. Wilson loves to garden, hike with her husband, and mountain bike ride. Also, Dr. Wilson can be found with her nose in a good novel or cheering on her favorite basketball team. GOOOO Kentucky Wildcats!

Dr. Wilson has a very unique teaching style that benefits many students. Her thorough instruction allows students to produce material that will not only earn them good grades, but will assist them in their career. Dr. Wilson believes in a " h ands on " style of teaching, her students have proved to learn most when learning the material from experimenting themselves.

Dr. Wilson contributes her time and efforts to many organizations on campus. One of these organizations is the Liberal Studies Committee and the Liberal Studies Revision Committee (LSRSC). The LSRSC is working diligently to revise the Liberal Studies requirements for the entire university. Dr. Wilson has been part of the committee for the past three years and has a part-time appointment in the Liberal Studies Office to help with the revision process.

COMM 475 Senior Portfolio Presentation

After the first week in March, you cannot help but stumble over the nearly 130 portfolios in Dr. Wilson 's office. Her Senior Portfolio Presentation class teaches students how to effectively arrange their work samples to show to potential employers.

This class is only offered in the spring semester. It meets two days a week until spring break. The one credit course is set up to end early in the semester so students will have their portfolios completed for internship and job interviews during the spring break.

Dr. Wilson has received positive feedback from students who claim that their finished portfolio placed them above the competition. For example, David Dibert stated that, "Both sites that I interviewed with found the hard copy portfolio highly informative and helpful to them. They also said that having the portfolio set me apart from others interviewing, and it is my belief that having the electronic and hard copy set me apart even further, and I am grateful for having the portfolio and will continue to use it."

She teaches her students how to design their portfolios to match their career interest. Students interested in TV and Radio use samples of their audio work or TV productions. Students interested in photography have enlarged pictures of their best photos while students interested in Public Relations tend to focus more on writing samples. Dr. Wilson teaches her students not only how to create a very professional looking portfolio, but also how to present the finished project. After students have competed the assignment, they are required to set up a mock interview with Dr. Wilson and present their work. Each student is able to personalize his final work by making dividers with their own designs.

The final portfolio has many different samples and includes work from broadcasting, graphics, photography, and gaming.



Dr. Wilson requires her students to present their material in leather binders with contents correctly labeled and divided by subjects. The paper and ink is of good quality which adds to the professionalism of their portfolios. Along with samples of their work is their resume, cover letter, recommendation letter, and a reference listing.

After all portfolios are submitted, the students compete with each other for the department's Klingensmith award. The award is presented to the student with the best portfolio. As in years past, the award will be presented to the student at commencement.
