Title/Topic: Secure Human Behaviors

Description: History has proven that technological issues cannot be solved with more technology. Millions of dollars are spent on emerging technologies, but the breaches continue to occur, bigger, and more sophisticated than ever before. Traditional "awareness trainings" are designed for compliance to provide legal cover for the organization rather than make their workforce secure.

Rather than concentrating solely on technology as a solution to cyber problems, the human brain should be trained through traditional means to detect, analyze, counter threats, anywhere, anytime, and in any domain. This talk will concentrate on human behaviors, patterns of life, and decisions people make that shape who they are. The talk will reference technologies as an enabler rather than primary solution to cyber problems.
