

ACCOMMODATED EXAM REQUEST SCHEDULE

Many students are eligible for accommodated exams (e.g., extended time, proctored, quieter environment, breaks, exam read, exam transcribed, etc.). If you are a student who is eligible for proctored exams, we are delighted that you are using the service. Since we serve a large volume of students, we must adhere to the following guidelines. These are necessary to ensure that we have a room and a proctor for you. If there is a huge problem with meeting a stated deadline, contact your D2A2 adviser by email. The D2A2 adviser will work with you towards a reasonable solution. (If you cannot remember the name of your D2A2 adviser, you may contact the office to ask at 724-357-4067 or disability-access@iup.edu)

Thursday	FRIDAY of the week before
Friday	Monday of the week of the exam

EXTENDED TIME EXAM REQUEST SUBMISSION DEADLINES – FINAL EXAMS

You can determine when your final exams are scheduled by checking the syllabus and/or http://www.iup.edu/news-events/calendar/academic/ and selecting the appropriate semester's link from the box on the left. If you are unsure, ask your professor and/or your D2A2 adviser.

Tuesday	TUESDAY of the week before
Wednesday	WEDNESDAY of the week before
Thursday	THURSDAY of the week before
Friday	FRIDAY of the week before

NOTE: <u>Graduate Candidacy and Comprehensive Exams</u> (Written and/or Oral) and Dissertation Defenses need to be discussed well in advance with your D2A2 adviser. Individual arrangements for these exams are handled on a case-by-case basis.
