

CURRICULUM CHECKLIST: ECONOMICS MAJORS

All IUP students must pass at least 120 credit hours (cr) with a minimum 2.0 grade point average (GPA) to graduate. Courses fall within three groups: the economics major, liberal studies (LS), and free electives.

Economics Controlled Electives (15 cr): No more than two ECON electives may be 200-level. At least one ECON controlled elective must be writing-intensive for ECON primary majors. A student may complete both writing-intensive courses within the major. Neither ECON 101 Basic Economics nor ECON 143 Financial Wellness counts as an ECON controlled elective.
