PROFESSIONAL STUDIES IN EDUCATION

Smith co-presented a paper on Influence of Graduate Coursework on "Teachers' Technological, Pedagogical, and Content Knowledge (TPACK) Skill Development "with Dr. Machado and Dr. DeAnna Laverick at the Society for Information Technology and Teacher Education conference in Nashville, TN in March 2011. In June 2011 Smith and Jiang co-presented a paper titled "Scholarship of Teaching and Learning Projects: The Intended and Unintended Benefits to Doctoral Graduate Assistants "Behind the Scenes" at the Teacher Scholar Symposium at Indiana University of Pennsylvania.


SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY

Together with their faculty mentors Dr. Lori Lumbard and Dr. David Stein, three students – Anne Rhoades, Kayla Kirkpatrick and Karen Cuddeback – presented their original research at the spring meeting of the Pennsylvania Speech-Language-Hearing Association. Lumbard, Rhoades, and Kirkpatric presented on objective & physiologic measures of voice in patients with thyroid disease; Stein and Cuddeback presented on criteria used by speech-language pathologists to decide readiness for discharge and discharge disposition for patients leaving in-patient rehabilitation facilities.

SOCIOLOGY

Recently retired faculty Dr. Tom Nowak and Dr. Kay Snyder, together with Alumni Molly Allen-O'Donnell (MA, 2006) and Marci Cottingham (MA, 2009). published an article on gender and food purchases in the Journal of Applied Social Psychology. Which was also highlighted on NPR.





Dr. Sue Reig and Dr. Kelli Paquette have co-edited a new book called Striving for the "Perfect" Classroom Part II: Teacher's Responsibilities Beyond Instruction and Assessment. The chapter authors include multiple IUP professors and three doctoral students –Hanna Brewer, Joyce Henderson, and Laura Strong.

Master's degree programs are changing rapidly

Some national trends include:

More programs are admitting Bachelor's students directly to a PhD.

Accelerated "4 - 1" programs where students obtain both a Bachelor's and a Master's degree in 5 years.

More flexible delievery methods: Saturday only, night only, online. This especially attracts working professionals.

Significant increase in fully online Master's degree programs by universities such as Oxford, Cornell, Stanford, Boston College, etc.

Rapid growth in Professional Science Master's degrees, that heavily involve industrial partners.

More multidisciplinary degree programs such as The Electronic Arts; Energy and the Environment

These changes are altering the landscape for all master's programs. We cannot control what other programs do that might take good students away from our programs. We can control how we respond to those incursions. Ways to combat increased competition include:

- •Have a unique program: Our Safety Sciences PhD is the 1st in the nation.
- •Have a really innovative program: MS in Strategic Studies in Weapons of Mass Destruction
- Have a very high quality program: PsyD program.
- Have a program that is high quality and in demand: Speech-Language Pathology MS (211 applicants, only 21 admitted).



This is more and more difficult each year as IUP's graduate programs are faced with an ever increasing set of competing programs in a variety of delivery formats. IUP masters degree enrollment declines

IUP's master's degree enrollment has declined by 143 students since 2008. In spite of this, several of our programs are doing very well! For example, there were 19 graduate programs or tracks that grew by 10% or more since last fall.



IUP Doctoral enrollment increases

We had 225 more applicants to our graduate programs than last year, but our graduate enrollment is down. IUP has 2,185 graduate students enrolled this fall. This is a 2.7% decline in enrollment. The decline is not in our doctoral programs, which are doing well:



Our doctoral enrollment will continue to improve as the new PhD in Safety Sciences degree program enrolls its first cohort in Summer 2013.

- Gradschools.com program listings

And, these five marketing techniques produced less than 3% of our inquires:

- Professional journal ads.

Dr. Branthoover Receives State Counselor Association President's Award



The Pennsylvania association is affiliated with the American Counseling Association, a six-hundred-member national organization that promotes the growth of the counseling profession.

As she presented the award, Jen Barna, association president, recognized Branthoover for "outstanding dedication" to the organization and for a "long and impressive record of service."

Branthoover was also recognized for her role in creating the association's first supervision registry, a secure, online registration process to connect highly qualified supervisors with counselors working to become licensed.

Branthoover has served in a number of leadership roles in the Pennsylvania Counseling Association, including president-elect, president, past president, and membership committee chairwoman. She also is chairwoman of the North Atlantic region of the American Counseling Association

In this position, she is a mentor and supporter of more than nine branch counseling associations in the eastern United States, Europe, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands. Because of her role, she gave a presentation in September at the District of Columbia Counseling Association membership drive and kickoff.
