

#### **ABOUT**

No matter how long ago the assault occurred, having a place to talk may be important for one's recovery process. The IUP Counseling Center offers free and confidential services.

The IUP Haven Project (in the Counseling Center) provides confidential services to IUP students.

There is no additional charge for these services.

#### **SERVICES**

- O1 Individual and Group Counseling
- O2 Assistance with safety planning
- O3 Assistance with university accommodations
  - Including academic, changing academic schedules, oncampus housing and oncampus employment
- O4 Assistance with reporting options
  - Discuss reporting options and the reporting process
  - Provide education about the student conduct process
  - Assistance filing a Title IX or student conduct report
  - Accompany student to file report or student conduct proceedings





### **MEDICAL SERVICES**

If you have been abused or assaulted, you may need medical care. To get medical help, immediately go to the nearest emergency department.

If you were sexually assaulted, you should receive information about pregnancy and/or disease prevention. You can also have evidence collected at an emergency department. Evidence collection should occur as soon as possible.

#### **TO PRESERVE EVIDENCE:**

- <u>DO NOT</u> shower, bathe, wash any part of your body.
- <u>DO NOT</u> use the bathroom.
- <u>DO NOT</u> change your clothes.
- <u>DO NOT</u> brush your teeth or gargle.
- <u>DO NOT</u> comb your hair.

# PENNSYLVANIA STATEWIDE AUTOMATED VICTIM INFORMATION AND NOTIFICATION (PA SAVIN)

The Pennsylvania SAVIN system is a service through which victims of a crime can use the phone or Internet to search for information regarding the custody status of their offender and to register to receive phone and/or email notification when the offender's custody status changes.

The VINE toll-free number for the PA SAVIN system is (866) 972-7284.

This service is provided to assist Victims of Crime who have a right to know about their offender's custody status.

The <u>Campus Sexual Assault Victim's Bill of Rights</u> requires all colleges and universities participating in federal student aid programs afford sexual assault victims certain basic rights.

- Survivors shall be notified of counseling services.
- Survivors shall be notified of options for changing academic and living situations.
- Survivors shall be notified of their option to notify law enforcement.
- Survivors shall be informed of the outcome of any disciplinary proceeding.
- Accuser and accused must have the same opportunity to have others present.
