ANNUAL COST ESTIMATE FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS ON F VISAS

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM COSTS 2025-2026

**The most popular on-campus room and meal costs are quoted. Undergraduate international students with fewer than 30 credits must live on-campus (unless over 21 or in the U.S. with their family). In addition, all exchange students are required to live in an IUP residence hall. Students living off-campus can find apartments ranging from \$600-\$1200 per month plus utilities.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND WORKING IN THE U.S.

Scholarships: International undergraduate students are automatically reviewed for a partial tuition waiver from the Office of International Education. No extra application is required. Recipients are notified of this award after admission, when immigration documents are sent. A partial tuition waiver award is \$210 per credit. This money is not awarded for distance education classes or during winter or summer terms. A service component is required to continue to receive this award.

Students admitted to the IUP Cook Honors College or selected as an International Intercollegiate Athlete for a Division II team will receive additional funding. More information will be sent directly to students selected for these programs.

Employment: If there are job openings, international students on F1 visas can work on-campus for a maximum of 20 hours per week when classes are in session. Students are generally paid \$7.25 per hour. Students can work up to 40 hours per week during breaks and winter/summer terms when not enrolled in classes. Students cannot work off-campus without additional work permission, which can be discussed with an international advisor in the Office of International Education. On-campus employment is not guaranteed.
