



#### IUP - MIYAZAKI PARTNERSHIP

A new agreement between the University of Miyazaki and IUP offers students expanded opportunities, including Japanese language instruction and in-person cultural experiences in Japan. ### WHAT OUR HAWKS ABROAD SAY






**Benita Abuo** Nigeria

### Experience With Kids School



I arrived at IUP in Fall 2021 with my daughter who was 11-years old at the time.
Wondering about her schooling, I sought details on enrollment,

tuition, and other things. Back in Nigeria, private schools though expensive, were the preferred choice for quality education. However, in addition to tuition, it is also the responsibility of the parents to purchase school supplies, uniform and also pay for busing their children to and from school if they can't personally drive them. Parents must also pay other expenses like the Parent-Teacher Association fees and other levies needed to maintain the schools. Public schools, while free, minimal expenses incurred supplies and fees, but the quality of education is not topnotch.

In the U.S., I discovered the majority of the people attend public schools. The schools are also known for excellent quality and free education, mostly funded by the government. Private schools, managed mostly by religious groups, have fewer attendees, and some typically require

parents to pay tuition.

In Nigeria, the education system includes Nursery, Primary (classes 1-6), Junior Secondary (classes 1-3), and Senior Secondary (classes 1-3). In most cases, schools especially the private ones often house all grades in the same compound or nearby, simplifying transportation issues for parents.

In Indiana and most U.S. schools however, schooling comprises Preschool and Elementary (grades PK-5), Middle (grades 6-8), and High School (grades 9-12). Public elementary students attend nearby schools, therefore, if you have children in different age groups, they will most likely go to different schools. However, private school enrollment isn't limited by location.
