

Jordan Albright: Assistant Athletic Director/Ticket Sales at Naval Academy



In his prior experiences, Reinsel accumulated a vast amount of knowledge across all NCAA Bylaws which led him to Pitt and his current position. While at Stony Brook, he was the main point of contact and managed all day-to-day operations for the Office of Athletics Compliance that consisted of 19 Division 1 sports and 520 student-athletes while supervising multiple interns and a Graduate Assistant on staff. Reinsel was able to successfully retool and rebuild the entire Office of Athletics Compliance while at Stony Brook to reestablish a vast rules educational program to capture all internal and external constituents; revamped all eligibility processes to improve consistency and timing of communication; implemented various monitoring procedures under the recruiting and playing/practice season bylaws; and finally implemented a department-wide

partnership with Teamworks, INFLCR, and ARMS Software to become fully operational. While at Grand Canyon, Reinsel managed all processes for Bylaws 11, 13, and 17, and the Internal and External Rules Educational programming among many other duties as assigned. While at Saint Peter's, Reinsel was tasked with oversight of all bylaws to help efficiency in the compliance office.

A 2014 graduate of Indiana University of Pennsylvania (IUP), and a 2016 graduate of St John's University (NY)- the Fighting Rick Pitino's, Reinsel has earned both his Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Sports Administration with Minors in Business and International Marketing.

An Oil City, Pennsylvania native, Reinsel resides in Wexford with his wife Emily, their dog Frank, and their soon-to-be-born baby (Due June 2024).

At IUP, you can get two master's degrees at the same time, through our graduate dual-enrollment program. How Do I apply?

Submit a separate application for each program you want to join.

On both applications, at the bottom of the Additional Information section, check "yes" when asked if you wish to obtain a dual graduate degree.

Submit the necessary supplemental items. You need to submit only one transcript for both of your applications. If equally applicable, you may also use your letters of recommendation for both programs. Two separate goal statements are encouraged.

MISSION STATEMENT

The Department of Kinesiology, Health, and Sport Science is a diverse and interdisciplinary department that offers multiple nationally accredited programs of study, including a Master of Science in Sport Management and Sport Studies, designed to:

- provide educational experiences that encourage lifetime health, fitness, and physical activity,
- prepare students for careers in sport management,
- foster service learning opportunities and partnerships within the university and with the local community,
- seek and develop ongoing funding, research, and scholarship opportunities to enhance academic programming and advance the knowledge base of the professional discipline.

CURRICULUM CORE COURSES FOR BOTH

TRACKS: 9 CREDITS

KHSS 634 Current Lit in Health, Fitness, and Sport (3 cr.)

Focus on knowledge and demonstrations of skills required for development of a master's thesis proposal. Emphasis is on research design and the statistics appropriate to analyze various types of research. Students will be involved in the identification, interpretation, and analysis of peer-reviewed research specific to the discipline of health, physical activity, and sport. (Prerequisite for KHSS 640)

KHSS 602 Sport Psychology (3 cr.) Study of the psychological effects and implications of a human's participation in sport and physical activity. Emphasis on personality and motivational dynamics as they relate to sport involvement in human behavior.

KHSS 640 Research Methods for Health, Sport, and Physical Activity (3 cr.) Provides a foundation for the research process in fields related to health and human performance. Types of research, writing a research report, and evaluation of commonly used techniques for data analysis are explored. Computer statistical programs and library resources are used to facilitate the student's development in reading and conducting research. (Prerequisite: KHSS 634)

SPORT MANAGEMENT

REQUIRED COURSES: 21 CREDITS

KHSS 635 Sport Leadership (3 cr.) Theory and practice of human management with applications to sport; formal structure of organizations, goal setting, organizational personality, group processes, and leadership styles.

KHSS 637 Sport Facilities Management (3 cr.)

An administrative and management course designed to prepare sport managers to develop and operate competitive, recreational, instructional, therapeutic, and multifaceted sports complexes.

KHSS 660 Governance of Intercollegiate Athletics (3 cr.)

Designed to be a study of issues evident in the governance of intercollegiate sport. The course will focus on evaluation of policies established, ramifications for violation of rules, and the procedures utilized by the NCAA to govern intercollegiate athletics.

KHSS 601 Sport and Society (3 cr.) Designed to acquaint the student with the reciprocal relationship between sport and physical activity as it affects a human's development in the societies and cultures out of which sport emerges.

KHSS 652 Globalization of Sport Business (3 cr.)

Focus will be on the application of knowledge in marketing, finance, sales, sponsorships, promotions, media, and public relations to the sports industry. Strategies specific to sports will be emphasized.

ELR 631 Human Resource Management (3 cr.)

This course will provide students with an in-depth analysis of human resource management with a special examination of public sector organizations.

KHSS 795 Thesis (6 cr.)

Core Courses: 9 Credits Required Courses: 21 Credits Elective Cources: 3 Credits Total 36 Credits

Non-thesis Track

All the same core and required classes as the thesis track except that KHSS 795 Thesis is replaced with KHSS 698. Internship (3 cr.) offered in the spring, summer, and fall semesters.

KHSS 698 Internship (3 cr.) Prospectus must be presented by student. Objective is to provide an in-depth experience in an area of interest to the

student under the guidance of a faculty member and a cooperating supervisor.

Thesis Track REQUIRED COURSES: 9 CREDITS

KHSS 601 Sport and Society (3 cr.) Designed to acquaint the student with the reciprocal relationship between sport and physical activity as it affects a human's development in the societies and cultures out of which sport emerges.

KHSS 603 Physiological Basis of Sport (3 cr.)

An examination of the physiological factors that influence performance in sport with emphasis on the analysis of various training techniques.

APPLICATION PROCESS AND ADMISSIONS

Applications must be submitted to Graduate Admissions at IUP. Applications must be submitted with the following items before they can be forwarded to the Department of Kinesiology, Health, and Sport Science:

- Application form (paper or online at IUP.edu/admissions/graduate)
- Nonrefundable application fee (\$50)
- Two letters of recommendation
- Goal statement
- Official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended

Applications are reviewed throughout the year, and admission decisions are made daily.

To be admitted to the MS in Sport Science program at IUP, applicants must meet the following criteria:

• Have earned a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university

• Have a minimum undergraduate GPA of 2.4 if the bachelor's degree was earned more than five years ago or a GPA of 2.6 if it was earned five or fewer years ago

Applicants who do not meet the undergraduate GPA criteria must submit a Miller Analogies Test (MAT) score of at least 395.

For international students: No GRE is required for the program; the minimum required TOEFL score is 76 (Internet-based).

Conditional admission is available for international students who do not meet language testing requirements.
