Curriculum

- HIST 265 The History of Power: Its Uses and Abuses -new course Liberal Studies Elective (information literacy).
 - All three outcomes start with identify and analyze....consider the following:
 - 1. Analyze visual images as expression of power.
 - 2. **Integrate*** different forms of power in the past. * needs to reflect the higher level of learning expected of the students to match the assessment tool. They are being asked to synthesize and create. This sounds like a really great project worth 40% of their grade and so needs to be represented in the outcome.
 - 3. **Illustrate** how power has been used and misused in the past.
 - In the Liberal Studies section under *How does this course fit into the designation*...needs more of a narrative of how the course actually fits into this competency of the Liberal Studies Electives rather than just a list of the EUSLOs met.
 - In the Liberal Studies section under *Liberal Studies courses must include the perspectives and contributions of ethnic and racial minorities and of women...* is quite generic. Needs to include more elaboration on what and how the perspectives and contributions of racial minorities and women will be addressed throughout the course.
