- ARHI 100 Arts of the 20th Century—course revision but new course for Knowledge Area Fine Arts, Global and Multicultural Awareness, distance education
 - o catalog description change—sentences need to start with verbs
 - In order to be considered part of the Knowledge Area Fine Arts assessments need to correspond with those other courses also part of this category. (Criteria for Fine Arts courses included at the end of the comments section.) Suggestions include:

- Develop reading, writing and critical thinking skills by analyzing works of art through recognition of stylistic patterns, and interpretation of meaning and content of works of art.

Recommended outcome

Find, access, and critically respond to at least two arts events in the broader context of historical, political, and social developments in the U.S.

Demonstrate understanding of primary source material such as readings or works of art.

- iv. Demonstrate understanding of primary source material such as readings or works of art.
