

MILESTONES IN IUP HISTORY

1860's

The Indiana Teacher Training Institute, along with prominent citizens of Indiana, Pennsylvania, discuss the need for improved teacher training.

1870's

1871: Pennsylvania General Assembly allocates money to establish the **Indiana Normal School**. Local funds support the construction of its first building, **John Sutton Hall**.

1875: Indiana Normal School holds its first session in Sutton Hall.

1876: Student enrollment reaches 225.

1890's

1893: **Wilson Hall** is constructed to house the Middle School.

1910's

1912: Student enrollment reaches 1,202.

1920's

1920: **Indiana State Normal School** is sold to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

1927: **Indiana State Teachers College** is created, offering 4-year undergraduate degrees.

1928: Student enrollment reaches 1,347.

1950's

1957: First graduate degrees are offered.

1959: The curriculum is expanded, and **Indiana State Teachers College** becomes **Indiana State College**.

1960's

1960: Student enrollment reaches 3,317.

1965: **Indiana State College** achieves University status.

1966: Student enrollment reaches 6,334.

1970's

1975: IUP celebrates its centennial with the renovation of **John Sutton Hall**.

1980's

1981: Construction of the **Stapleton Library** complex is completed.

2000's

2006: Student enrollment reaches 14,081.

2007: Residence Revival begins with construction of **Delaney Hall**.

2008: Fisher Auditorium and Waller Hall are renovated and become the **Performing Arts Center**.

2010's

2011: **Kovalchick Convention and Athletic Complex** opens.

2015: The **College of Humanities and Social Sciences** building is completed.

2018: **Whitmyre Hall**, built in 1952 and home of the **Cook Honors College**, is renovated.

2020's

2020-2021: Construction begins on the **Kopchick College of Natural Sciences** building.
