In the meantime, know that your degree and future degrees are in good hands. Remember we are your musical home! Come back and visit when you can!

Dr. Sarah Mantel retires

Dr. Sarah Mantel served on the IUP faculty as Professor of Voice and Director of Opera and Music Theatre at Indiana University of Pennsylvania from 1986 to her retirement in May of 2013.

As Director of Opera/Music Theatre at IUP, Dr. Mantel directed over sixty mainstage opera and musical theater productions, including such diverse genres as The Marriage of Figaro. The Pirates of Penzance, The Tender Land, West Side Story and White Christmas. She developed the opera/music theater program to include a season of two mainstage productions each year and a performance each semester of the Music Theatre Workshop and the Opera Workshop. In addition to developing a consistent program for undergraduate training in opera and musical performance skills, Dr. Mantel joined with the Department of Theatre and Dance in 1990 to begin collaboration between the two departments for the production of a mainstage musical each academic year. This joint collaboration has benefited numerous music and theater students for the past 23 years and is a highlight of the College of Fine Arts performance schedule.

She is the founder and co-director of the Festival of Women Composers at IUP, which, since its inception in 1990, has become a highly respected symposium, with scholarly and artistic participation on a national and international level. She is the recipient of grants from the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts, Meet-the-Composers, and the National Endowment for the Arts to sponsor performances and commissions of the works of women composers.

Dr. Mantel has published thirteen articles in national and state refereed journals, with the most recent entitled "Women Composers and the American Musical: The Early Years," which appeared in the *Journal of Singing* May/ June issue of 2013. Dr. Mantel has held national offices in the National Opera Association and continues to be an active member of the National Association of Singing, the College Music Society, and the International Alliance for Women in Music.

Dr. Mantel says that she misses all her students, past and present, and would love to hear from them.



The Jim Self Chamber Brass Collection

Jim Self, a Distinguished Alumnus of IUP and world renowned tuba and low brass player has endowed a collection of brass chamber music at IUP. He was born in Franklin. Pennsylvania and grew up in nearby Oil City. He holds degrees from IUP, Catholic University, and a Doctor of Musical Arts from the University of Southern California where he is an Adjunct Professor of Tuba and Chamber Music. Jim has been a free-lance musician in Los Angeles since 1974 and has worked for all the major Hollywood studios performing for over 1500 motion pictures and hundreds of television shows and records. His solos in major films include John William's scores to Jurassic Park, Home Alone I & II, Hook and he was the "Voice of the Mothership" from Close Encounters of the Third Kind. He is a past president of I.T.E.A and a former member of The United States Army Band. He has published over fifty solo, chamber, and symphonic works, available through his company Basset Hound Music.

The "Jim Self Chamber Brass Collection" is housed in the Orendroff Music Library. Every piece of music in his collection has a label (shown below). So far his endowment has purchased more than fifty brass ensemble works, trios, quartets and quintets. This has given a significant resource for the brass faculty and students at IUP and provides a lasting legacy for Jim Self.

New Music Faculty

The IUP Department of Music welcomes two new tenure-track faculty:

Dr. Jacob Ertl, a native of Appleton, Wisconsin, has performed across the United States, and abroad in Europe, Israel, Canada, and Mexico. A winner of numerous national and international competitions, Ertl has given multiple performances at Carnegie Hall's Weill Recital Hall and debuted at Merkin Concert Hall in NYC, on Chicago Radio's "Live from WFMT" series, Wisconsin Public Radio's "Live from the Elvehjem" series, and performed with the Milwaukee Chamber Orchestra and Fox Valley Symphony. He is regularly invited to give guest recitals and master classes at universities and colleges and frequently performs solo and chamber music at numerous international music festivals. For the past six years Ertl has been the Artist-in-Residence Fellow for PianoArts. where he has performed hundreds of interactive outreach concerts and collaborated with over twenty public schools. Ertl completed the Doctor of Musical Arts degree at the Eastman School of Music, where he served as teaching assistant for Nelita True. He also earned his Master's degree from Eastman and his Bachelor's degree from the Oberlin Conservatory of Music, studying with Robert Shannon. He previously taught on the faculty of the Hochstein School of Music and Dance, and as an applied piano and class piano instructor at the Eastman School of Music and the Ober-

lin Conservatory of Music. Ertl is currently on the piano faculty at IUP and the summer piano faculty at the Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp and the Dakota Sky International Piano Festival.



Dr. John Levey

Dr. John Levev is Director of Music Theory at IUP. Dr. Levey completed a Ph.D. in Composition and Music Theory as a Regents Fellow at the University of Michigan. He also holds a M.M. in Composition from the University of Michigan and a B.M. in Composition from the Oberlin Conservatory of Music. Prior to his appointment at IUP Dr. Levey served as Director of Music at the University of Pittsburgh at Bradford. He was also Director of Interdisciplinary Arts, a program that integrates art, music, theater, and writing. Dr. Levey's research focuses on art music of the twentieth and twenty-first centuries, particularly serial and post-serial music. He is presently studying vocal works by the late American composer Peter Lieberson. Performances of Dr. Levey's compositions have taken place at the Music07 Festival in Cincinnati, Harvard University, Boston College, and the Chelsea Art Museum in New York. He recently finished a piano piece commissioned by the University of Pittsburgh at Bradford for their fiftieth anniversary. Dr. Levey is a member of the American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers, Society of Composers, Society for Music Theory, College Music Society, and Pi Kappa Lambda National Music Honor Fraternity. In his spare time he enjoys running, hiking, and mountain biking. He is a bit of a car nut and is fascinated by space exploration and rocket propulsion.

Dr. Ryan Beeken was recently named Artistic Director for the Blair Concert Chorale in Altoona, PA. He presented a clinic entitled "Conductor-Creature Versus Conductor-Teacher: Establish Priorities and Rekindle the Passion" at the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association Annual Conference held in Erie, PA, in April, 2013. Additionally, he served as an adjudicator for the High Note Music Festival, Dorney Park, Allentown, Pennsylvania, in May 2013, Music in the Parks, Kennywood, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, May 2013, at the Fox Chapel Area High School Concert Choir Invitational, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, April 2013 and the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association Music Performance Assessment, Hermitage, Pennsylvania, April 2013. He served as guest conductor for the Armstrong County High School Honor Choir, the St. Louis Metro District 8 All-District Honor Choir, St. Louis, Missouri, the Indiana County High School Honor Choir and the Mucho Macho Men's Choir Festival held at North Hills High School all during November 2013, and will serve as the guest conductor for the District 3 High School Honor Choir in January 2014, the PMEA Region III High School Honor Choir in February 2014, and the Blair County Junior High Honor Choir in February, 2014. Dr. Beeken will be the featured guest artist at The Ohio State University in January, 2014, where he will present lectures to music education and graduate choral conducting classes, give master classes with conducting students, and will guest conduct university ensembles.

Dr. Stephanie Caulder presented an invited clinic titled: "Why Not Play the Oboe? Tips and Strategies for Success" at the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association annual state conference, held in Erie, PA, on April 18–20, 2013.

Dr. Stanley Chepaitis has released a recording of music by alumnus composer **Mike Barnett** (BFA 96, MM 98). The recording features Mike's heavy metal compositions with Dr. Chepaitis playing solo violin, including his own improvisations, and rhythm viola parts. Mike plays drums and Nathan Santos plays bass. The band is called Terminal Degree and the album is titled *The Middle of No When.* It is available on iTunes, CD Baby and Amazon. There is also a Terminal Degree Facebook page where you can hear samples and comment.

In June IUP trombone professor **Dr**. **Christian Dickinson** performed at the International Trombone Festival in Columbus, GA. He was a member of a faculty and professional trombone ensemble that is named in honor of Dickinson's teacher, William Cramer.

Armstrong Concert Band Scholarship for Trombone (0443)

The Armstrong Concert Band Scholarship for Trombone was established to honor the dedication and talent of the membership of the Armstrong Concert Band and in tribute to John Schad and his passion for music. An eligible candidate must be enrolled as a full-time undergraduate student with a declared trombone major in the Department of Music.

Gary and Kaye Bird Euphonium Scholarship (0538)

Dr. Gary Bird, retired IUP professor of Music, established this scholarship in support of the Tuba/Euphonium Studio. A student selected to receive the scholarship must be a Music Education major with a Euphonium emphasis.

Wallis and Janet Braman Music Scholarship (0118)

Awarded to an incoming freshman music major whose performing area is one of the following: violin, viola, cello, or double bass.

Freshman Music Scholarship (5070)

Student must be an incoming freshman music major. Awards are based on performance ability and equally shared among all applied studios (instruments and voice).

Joan Frey Boytim Scholarship for Keyboard Accompanist (0468)

Joan Frey Boytim completed a Bachelor of Science in Music in 1955 and a Master of Education in Music in 1964 at IUP. With more than forty-five years of teaching experience, she is a nationally recognized expert in the field of teaching pre-collegiate and adult community voice. A gracious gift from Mrs. Boytim provides for the award of a scholarship to a senior-level student who has demonstrated interest, success, and the promise of continued success as a keyboard accompanist for recitalists, small ensembles, or choral organizations.

Joan Frey Boytim Scholarship for Vocal Performance (0452 and 0485)

A gracious gift from Mrs. Boytim provides for the award of two scholarships, one to a senior-level female student and a second to a senior-level male student that have demonstrated interest, success, and the promise of continued success in vocal performance.

Margaret McCluskie Clark Scholarship for Violin (0514)

Frank M. Clark established this scholarship in honor and tribute to his wife, Margaret McCluskie Clark. Mrs. Clark graduated with a bachelor's degree in music education from Indiana State Teachers College in 1951. The scholarship is awarded to a student with a declared major in the Music Department with violin as his/her primary performing medium.

Charles A. and Clarabell Tweed Davis Memorial Music Scholarship (0130)

This scholarship is awarded to one or more rising sophomores enrolled in the Music Department. The recipient must exhibit outstanding musical skills in a particular musical discipline and contribute to the musical discipline and the university through ensembles, recitals, etc.

Richard Dellaposta Memorial Scholarship for Trumpet (0565)

This scholarship is not yet endowed. It will be given to deserving trumpet players attending IUP. Rich was a graduate of Homer Center High School where he played in the concert band, jazz band, marching band, and was a participant in county, district, and regional band, and the IUP Honors Band. Rich had hoped to enter the IUP Department of Music as a music major when his life was cut tragically short. His family and friends have established this scholarship in his memory.

Frank and Mary Gorell Scholarship for Music (0182)

Established by longtime Indiana residents and patrons of the arts, this scholarship benefits outstanding and talented students enrolled in the Department of Music with a concentration in the string program.

Florence E. Haug Marching Band Scholarship (0467)

Florence E. Haug served as secretary/ administrative assistant to six presidents at IUP over a period spanning twentyfive years. Ms. Haug enjoys all areas of the College of Fine Arts, in particular the IUP Marching Band. Her generous support provides a scholarship to a full-time student from the college with a major in music participating as a member of the marching band.

Ann M. Hayward Music Scholarship (0153)

Awarded to entering freshman vocal majors by recommendation of faculty.

Matthew Robert Hornick Memorial Scholarship for Music Education (0482)

Mr. Hornick was a 2002 graduate of IUP with a degree in Music Education. The scholarship, established in his memory by his parents, Chris ('68) and Mary Louise Hornick, provides support for an incoming freshman in the clarinet studio.

H. Eugene Hulbert Music Scholarship (0145)

Awarded to a student majoring in Music Education, Music Performance, or Liberal Arts on the basis of academic excellence, music excellence, and financial need.

Gloria Bryan Johnson Memorial Scholarship (0176)

Awarded to a full-time music student, to an incoming freshman, or to an upperclassman cello or bass major by recommendation of faculty.

Gary J. Olmstead Percussion Scholarship (0277)

Established to honor the talents and career of a distinguished faculty member and musician, this scholarship is awarded to outstanding students in the Department of Music who are studying percussion.

Jim and Jamie Self Tuba Scholarship (0357)

Jim Self ('65), a prominent studio tuba player in Los Angeles, has generously created a scholarship for a tuba player. The award is based on the student's talent and "citizenship" in the department.

Kenneth M. Sell Memorial Scholarship for Music (0490)

The Kenneth M. Sell Memorial Scholarship for Music provides annual support for a talented and deserving student enrolled within the Music Department who demonstrates the highest level of excellence and exceptional talent during the audition process.

Evelyn Swauger Memorial Scholarship (0296)

Awarded to undergraduate or graduate piano majors in the Department of Music.

Carol Teti Memorial Scholarship (0295)

Preference given to undergraduate organ majors within the Department of Music; secondary preference may be given to graduate students or students enrolled in other majors.


