I continue to be surrounded by an amazing artist-teacher faculty. As I regularly tell prospective students, our resident faculty



We are fortunate to have Dr. David Ferguson (former music faculty member and Assistant Dean) serve as Interim Dean this academic year and will look forward to welcoming a new Dean of the College of Fine Arts this summer.

As I mentioned in our last newsletter, we purchased a beautiful new sound shell for Gorell Recital Hall and just this week, the contractors began work on replacing the entire lighting system in the hall. This will give us a more modern look and professional capabilities, but Gorell will retain its historic charm (including, for now, the orange seats!) We are very grateful to the administration of the university for providing the funding necessary to make these updates in our primary performing space. Some other big news includes the submission of the Self-Study and completion of the site visit as part of our reaccreditation from the National Association of Schools of Music. We must apply for reaccreditation every ten years and it is always a time to reflect on the many things we do so well, as well as where there may be room for improvement.

I want to thank those of you who have given financial support to the department or may be thinking about such a gift for the future. You can read about these giving opportunities in this newsletter. I can promise you that your investment in our department will be used wisely and will continue the rich tradition of excellence in the IUP Department of Music. I will close with a quote from alumnus and current faculty member Dr. Jason Worzbyt who often says that "musicians use their heads, their hands, and their hearts." The world continues to need creative people and music right now. It is among the most powerful tools mankind has to bring us together.




Department Notes

The IUP Department of Music is happy to welcome **Dr. Colleen Ferguson** and **Dr. John Bagnato** to the faculty. Dr. Ferguson is Assistant Professor of Violin and Viola, and conducts the IUP Symphony Orchestra. Dr. Bagnato is Assistant Professor of Guitar

and teaches Applied Guitar and Guitar Ensemble.

Indiana Musicale's 5th Annual Monster Piano Concert was held on February 3, 2018. This popular piano ensemble event featured 30 elementary, middle and high school



IUP's Department of Music and the Flute New Music Consortium co-hosted a contemporary music residency featuring composers Carter Pann and Bekah Simms on March 2–3, 2018.

On Sunday, March 4, 2018, the Carol Teti Memorial Organ Scholarship Committee hosted a recital by internationally acclaimed organist James Kibbie. Kibbie presented the world premiere of Christopher LaRosa's Monument (2017), in addition to works by Alain, Bach, Franck, Ropek, and Sowande. Prior to the recital, John Levey facilitated a pre-concert discussion with LaRosa, whose "Monument" is the third composition to win the annual Ronald G. Pogorzelski and Lester D. Yankee Memorial Competition. Kibbie also presented a master-class.

Zach Collins and the IUP Chapter of the International Tuba Euphonium Association hosted the fourth annual Tubaphonium Day on Sunday, March 18, 2018. Tuba, euphonium, and baritone players of all ages were invited to join the IUP Tuba and Euphonium Studio for a day of performance and learning. The musicians participated in master-classes, heard a recital by guest euphonium soloist Lance LaDuke,

and performed as part of a mass tubaeuphonium ensemble. Collins and eight members of the IUP Tuba and Euphonium Studio traveled to the 2018 International Euphonium Tuba Festival (IET), held at

perform for the National Association for Music Education (NAfME) Eastern Division Conference in April of 2019. The University Chorale and Ryan Beeken also hosted 75 singers from Central Dauphin High School for a choral exchange on November 7, 2018.

IUP Chorale

The second annual Squawkfest took place on April 7, 2018. The clarinet day featured performances by Dr. Phillip Paglialonga of the University of North Texas and MUCS Lynda Dembowski of the US Naval Academy band. 30 participants descended upon the IUP campus for a large ensemble performance, masterclasses, and workshops with guest artists and IUP clarinet professor, Rosemary Engelstad. Anthony McDonnell (BSEd 2018) guest conducted the IUP Clarinet Choir and Rosemary Engelstad, Amanda Morrison, and Laura Armstrong, along with Shana Simmons Dance Studio, premiered David Martynuik's "Masque for Clarinet Trio and Dancers."

The **Trumpet Studio** at Indiana University of Pennsylvania hosted its annual "Trumpet Day" on Sunday, April 15, 2018. Forty trumpet players, from 6th graders to adult, attended. The day began with a warmup session led by Dr. Kevin Eisensmith, professor of trumpet at IUP, along with Michael Sachs, the featured artist for the event. Mr. Sachs is the principal trumpeter with the Cleveland Orchestra. He presented a clinic in the afternoon that covered numerous topics related to the trumpet. Participants rehearsed during the day and performed David Marlatt's "Spring" as a

prelude to the afternoon recital given by Mr. Sachs. Among the works he performed were Giuseppe Torelli's Sonata No. 1 in D, Hummel's Concerto in E-flat and the Arutunian Trumpet Concerto. Mr. Sachs was accompanied by Dr. Henry Wong Doe and Dr. Sun Min Kim, members of the IUP music department's piano faculty.

IUP Opera Theater had its first miniopera tour from May 15 to May 22, 2018. IUP faculty members Oliver Lo, Joseph Baunoch, and Evan Engelstad and IUP students Jocelynn Ziegmann and Arlene Ivory performed for over 450 students from Titusville Area High School, Kiski Area High School, Punxsutawney Area High School, Penn Cambria Elementary School, West Shamokin High School, and Waynesburg Central H.S..

IUP hosted the 2018 Pennsylvania Music Teachers Association State Conference on June 8-10 2018. The conference brought around 50 private teachers to campus. IUP piano faculty **Dr. Henry Wong Doe** served as both conference co-chair and site coordinator. He also performed and premiered PMTA commissioned composer Daniel Temkin's work "Dreamed Landscapes" on the IUP Faculty recital.

A select group of ten students from the IUP Horn Choir, along with IUP horn professor Dr. Heidi Lucas, recently traveled to Muncie, IN to attend and perform at the 50th annual International Horn Symposium. The horn choir presented works by composers including Ingram, Gulino, Litton and IUP alum Jude Gore. The Horn Studio also hosted their 2nd Annual Horn Day on May 5, 2018, featuring guest artists David Wakefield (former horn player with the American Brass Quintet for over 30 years), and Jessie Thoman (horn professor at UT-Martin). The day featured nearly 40 participants.

On Tuesday, October 9, the **Department of Music** hosted the Fifth Annual Crimson Hawk Invitational Choral Conference with over 340 students from twenty-four different school districts in attendance.

On October 30th, over two hundred middle school students and sixteen directors attended the inaugural Middle

School Band Summit at IUP, as organized by Jason Worzbyt. This event featured an honor band for the middle school students, professional development clinics for the directors, and a recital during the afternoon performed by IUP music faculty and students. A concert, featuring all 200 students, brought this event to a close.

The IUP Department of Music hosted an Alumni Jazz Weekend on November 2-4, 2018. Thirty alumni and guests, with graduation dates spanning six decades and traveling from as far away as Sacramento, California, returned to IUP for the weekend's festivities, which included a reception at Breezedale Alumni Center on Friday evening, rehearsals during the day on Saturday, attendance at an evening performance presented by the IUP Jazz Band and Jazz Ensemble, and a performance on Sunday afternoon. The featured alumnus for the weekend was Joshua Hillard (BSEd 2001). The guest conductor for the Sunday

afternoon performance was Paul Murtha, a native of Johnstown, Pennsylvania.



The IUP Faculty Woodwind Quintet (Therese Wacker, flute; Stephanie Caulder, oboe; Rosemary Engelstad, clarinet; Heidi Lucas, horn; and Jason Worzbyt, bassoon) completed a tour of Northern New Jersey area schools on November 26-28, 2018. They performed and worked with students in eleven sessions over their 2.5-day tour. Schools visited included Northern Highlands Regional High School, Northern Valley Regional High School at Old Tappan, Northern Valley Regional High School (Demarest), Jackson Memorial High School, and West Orange High School.

For a second year the IUP String Area and Johnstown Symphony Orchestra (JSO) have teamed up to support music education in the region. Under the umbrella of the newly formed JSO Education Committee, several new initiatives have been established to provide more opportunities for IUP music students as well as young musicians in the area. Beginning in the fall of 2017, IUP faculty member Dr. Linda Jennings was invited to coach the Honors String Quartet of the Johnstown Symphony Youth Orchestra (JSYO) on a bi-monthly basis to perform on the JSYO annual concerts and outreach concerts at area public schools. The JSYO Honors Quartet season for Fall 2018 began with a three-hour workshop in August on the IUP campus led by Dr. Jennings who continues to coach the ensemble this year. In another initiative, the IUP String Area and the JSYO joined efforts to host the first IUP/JSYO String Chamber Orchestra Festival on Saturday, September 22 in Cogswell Hall on the IUP campus. This event was designed to promote string playing in the area by bringing string players in the region together for a festive, non-competitive day of music making. The day featured high school string players under the baton of Dr. Colleen Ferguson, IUP violin/viola professor and Orchestra director, and David Anderson, JSYO Director. The program was organized by Dr. Jennings and supported by the IUP String Area, JSYO, and the IUP String Project. The IUP String Project, under the direction of Dr. Linda Jennings, continues its mission of providing quality string education for students in the area and mentoring future string educators. This year the IUP String Project looks forward to a new partnership with the Chiang Rai Youth Orchestra (CYO) in northern Thailand. The CYO, led by Director Paramet Lerdkasem, is one of the leading string youth programs in Thailand. Plans are under way for the IUP String Project to host 4-5 CYO students on the IUP campus where they will participate in String Project and IUP String Area events in April 2019.

Through the determined efforts of our department chair **Stephanie Caulder**, we are now lucky to have a new look and sound in Gorell Auditorium! The new shell was installed in the early spring of 2018.

Joseph Baunoch, Associate Professor of Voice, was elected vice president of the Tri-States Chapter of the National Association of Teachers of Singing.

Director of Choral Studies, Dr. Ryan Beeken, has maintained a productive schedule during 2018. Beeken conducted 11 festivals, including the Florida All-State Male Honor Choir, the North Central and Central ACDA Division Conference Changing Male Voice Honor Choir and A Cappella Abroad in Prague and Vienna. Beeken also presented a session at the 2018 PMEA Annual In-Service Conference and served as the headlining clinician for state ACDA Conferences in South Dakota and Oklahoma. Beeken has also continued to serve as an adjudicator at various festivals in Pennsylvania, Maryland, West Virginia, and Michigan. Finally, the IUP Chorale was selected via a blind, peerreviewed process to perform present the Together We Sing Session for the Eastern ACDA Division Conference and for the PMEA In-Service Conference.

Dr. Beeken also notes, "I am excited to share that the IUP Department of Music now offers graduate work in choral conducting for both on campus and distance learning! Not only can we continue to offer fully-funded graduate assistantships for qualified full-time students, but practicing teachers can now also pursue a graduate degree in choral conducting while maintaining their teaching positions. We have openings for both full-time and part-time students beginning Fall 2019."

Stephanie Caulder presented an Act 48 session titled "Why Not Play the Oboe? Tips and Strategies for Success" at the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association District 1 Junior High Band Festival on March 2, 2018, at Mt. Lebanon High School in Pittsburgh. Caulder also worked with over 150 high school students from 15 school districts as guest conductor for the Huntington and Cambria All-County Band

Festivals during November 2018.

Zach Collins presented a clinic to area band directors on Friday, February 23, at the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association Region II Band Festival, held at West Shamokin High School. His clinic discussed the benefits of building a strong low brass section for the wind band and strategies for inspiring and challenging young low brass musicians. Collins also performed on a recital honoring the contributions of Jim Self (BSEd 1965) to the solo tuba repertoire. The recital, held on Monday, February 19, 2018 was part of a week-long residency by Jim Self at the University of Tennessee.

Craig Denison's chapter on "Boychoir Pedagogy" was published in April 2017 in the Oxford Handbook of Choral Pedagogy by Oxford University Press. The book was dedicated to the memory of Robert Page, long-time director of the Mendelssohn Choir of Pittsburgh, and features the writing of 25 other leading choral pedagogues.

Kevin Eisensmith recently attended the annual conference of the International Trumpet Guild. This year's conference was held May 28–June 2, 2018, in San Antonio, Texas. Eisensmith currently serves as secretary of the organization, and previously served as president from 2009 to 2011. He was one of approximately 400 trumpet players who participated in the opening ceremony's fanfare.

Rosemary Engelstad was selected to present at the New Jersey Music Educators Association Conference on February 23, 2018. The title of her session was "Essential Tips for Quality Clarinet Tone Production."

IUP faculty members Colleen Ferguson (violin) and Linda Jennings (cello) presented performances and workshops at schools in central Pennsylvania October 30–November 1, 2018. Ferguson also led the PSO Symphony pre-concert Q&A session with Masetro Manfred Honeck and Pinchas Zuckerman on September 27.

IUP music faculty member Linda Jennings was invited to present lectures on string pedagogy topics and a chamber music master class for string students at James Madison University, VA in October of 2017. Linda Jennings also presented an Act 48 session titled "It's All About the Bass: Cello

and Bass Techniques for All Levels in a Heterogeneous Setting" at the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association District 4 and 6 High School Orchestra Festival on February 2018 at Bedford High School. She presented the same session at the PMEA Annual State Conference on April 19, 2018, in Lancaster, PA

Heidi Lucas performed with her trio, the Blenheim Brass, at the International Trombone Festival in Iowa City, Iowa in July of 2018. The group presented a full recital of premieres they had commissioned. Lucas also won a position with the Wintergreen Festival Orchestra in Wintergreen, VA; she played her first season with them in July, 2018.

Timothy Paul and the Department of Music hosted the fifth annual International Fellowship of Conductors, Composers, and Collaborators (IFC3) June 11-15, 2018 at IUP. He also served as the 13th annual Utah State University (Logan, UT) guest conductor for their Tri-State festival on Nov 29-Dec 2, 2018. While there, he also taught classes on conducting and worked with private students.

Therese Wacker performed the world premiere of Carter Pann's *Giantess* for flute and piano on March 3, 2018 at 4pm in Gorell Recital Hall.

Dr. Henry Wong Doe's latest album "Pictures" (Rattle Records) was nominated to be a finalist in the 2018 New Zealand Music Awards (Best Classical Artist Category). Over the summer Wong Doe performed in New York City on June 29, 2018 with violinist Eugenia Choi at Yamaha Artist Services Piano Salon. He also performed Rachmaninoff's 2nd Piano Concerto with the Auckland Philharmonia Orchestra in New Zealand on August 9, 2018. The Rachmaninoff performance was critically acclaimed in the New Zealand Herald. Additionally, on April 4, 2018 Wong Doe gave a master class to piano majors at Duquesne University at the invitation of Professor David Allen Wehr. He also gave a recital at West Liberty University, West Virginia on November 30, 2018 at the invitation of Dr. Gerald Lee.

Dr. Jason Worzbyt resurrected the Keystone Chamber Winds, which last performed 5 years ago. Comprised of students and faculty, the group performed works by Reed,

Dolores A. Hackerson (BSEd 1951) celebrated her 88th birthday and 66th alumna year on January 20, 2018. She continues to sing at the Terrace of Chestnut Hill Assisted Living facility and praise the Lord. Dolores was a member of the first Afro-American graduating class at IUP.

Carolyn Heilman Kennedy (BSEd 1959) taught for a total of 36 years: in Stoneboro, PA (3 years), Ford City, PA (32 years), as well for 1 year as a full time substitute in Kittanning, PA. In addition, she played alto saxophone in a Gospel group called "The Victory 5" for nine years. She is married to Fred Kennedy; they have 9 grand children and 7 great grand children.

Cathryn A. (Gordon) Harvey (BSEd 1972) earned her M.Ed from the Unviersity of Virginia in Charlottesville, VA, after completing her degree at IUP. She spent the next 42 years teaching music in public and private schools from California to New Hampshire. She and her husband raised 4 boys. Though currently retired, she serves on the local school board and as a Library Trustee. In addition, she is also a state representative in the New Hampshire State House, serving on the Fish and Game committee.

Dr. Sue A. McCarthy Malin (BSEd 1972) taught music in Loyalsock, PA for two years afer graduating from IUP with a major in voice. She then went on to start her graduate studies at Penn State and Duquesne, and married a professional theatre director/classical musician (Denis). After moving to Grand Rapis, MI, she taught music (full time) in the East Grand Rapids Public School for over 9 years. While there, her husband directed at the Grand Rapids Civic Theatre and together they composed music for four productions. Sue continued to perform with the Rapids Symphony Choir, Grand Rapids Symphonic Band, and on classical flute and voice in recigals at the St. Cecelia Music Society and local churches. She studied with the principal flautist of the Grand Rapids Symphony Orchestra, Chris Kantner, completed her Master of Music degree, studying voice with Paul Benningfield, at the School of Music at

Michigan State University. She was selected as music assessment administrator for the Michigan Education State Department. By 1983, she accepted a full time, tenure track faculty position at Lock Haven University, where she taught music education classes for pre-service teachers, and flute and voice. She performed frequently with the university ensembles. Her husband established Independent Artist Enterprsies (IAE). Under this banner, their jazz group (Swing Reunion Band), several classical groups, and their additional talents in visual arts were promoted. In the jazz group, Sue was the lead on vocals and her husband was lead on clarinet. The chamber groups specialized in Baroque and Classical music with Sue playing flute and her husband playing various clarinets. They performed extensively at LHU and regionally, including a performance with the Philadelphia Chamber Soloists. Sue also co-authored research with Dr. Albert Leblanc, MSU, and was honored to be published in the Music Educators Journal (MEJ) and the Journal of Research in Music Education (JRME). In 1993, Sue received her Doctorate in Music Education from Penn State. A couple years later, at LHU, she was promoted to full professor, and then went on to chair the music department and became director of the Master of Liberal Arts. She presented numerous papers and presentations throughout the country for music education, American music topics, and assessment. She was an invited lecturer at Liverpool Hope University College, Liverpool, England. In Liverpool, she delivered sessions on the roots of blies and the music cirriculum in US general music classes. Dr. Malin achieved and served in the position of Acting Dean of the College of Education and Human Services at LHU for several years. After a rich, 35 year career in public education, she retired at LHU (24 years) as Professor Emerita of Music. As members of the American Recorder Society, Sue and her husband, Denis, are still active with Renaissance and Baroque music. They also take time to work on their individual arts.

Jennifer Dibert (BA 2017) is currently a clarinetist for the 399th Army Band at Fort Leonard Wood, MO.


