

Department Notes

The IUP Music Department presented an evening of music by world-renowned African-American composer Alvin Singleton on Thursday, November 13, 2014. Students and faculty were featured in six of Singleton's chamber works.



Indiana Musicale, the Indiana Chapter of the Pennsylvania Music Teachers Association, hosted its second annual Piano Monster Concert on Sunday, February 8, 2015. IUP Piano faculty members Jacob Ertl and Henry Wong Doe directed the event, which included piano students from 16 elementary and high schools in Indiana, Armstrong, Cambria, and Allegheny counties. Twelve grand and upright pianos were moved into Cogswell Hall 121 for the two-day event. The IUP Piano Ensemble, consisting of current piano majors studying at IUP, was also featured in the event. Students from the ensemble performed in the concert and coached the students during the Saturday rehearsal day.

On Tuesday, February 17, 2015, members of the Wildcat Regiment Band gathered to present music faculty members Jack Stamp and Jason Worzbyt with a plaque commemorating the ensemble's latest recording, "Music from the Port Royal Band 1863-1864." Dr. Stamp and Dr. Worzbyt served as producers for the ensemble's third recording. The band also made a generous donation to the Music Department's general scholarship fund.

In his final concert with the IUP Wind Ensemble, Stamp presented a program featuring world premiere performances of works by Anthony O'Toole, Molly Joyce, Carl Holmquist, and Daniel French. Lastly, the Wind Ensemble performed "A Jack Stamp Suite," with movements by contributing composers Bruce Yurko, Andrew Boysen, Timothy Broege, Timothy Mahr, and Mark Camphouse. The weekend concluded with a performance by the Keystone Wind Ensemble. Pictures from the event can be

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The Airmen of Note, the premier jazz ensemble of the United States Air Force, presented a concert in Fisher Auditorium in September 2015.

Eight music education students and two IUP faculty members achieved Level 1 certification in Modern Band Pedagogy August 30, 2015, at Slippery Rock University. This Modern Band training was provided by Little Kids Rock, whose mission is to provide free training, instruments, and resources to teachers. The students and faculty got a crash course on teaching and playing guitar, electric bass, keyboard, and drum set. Among the highlights of this experience was the good-natured rivalry between IUP students and participants from other Pennsylvania State System institutions, which resulted in the creation of an original tune.

Faculty Notes

Joseph Baunoch was invited to be on faculty for the Opera Festival di Roma held in Rome, Italy. He spent two weeks in summer 2015 teaching voice students from all over the country. He taught voice as well as aided in the students' preparation for two operas, Mozart's Le Nozze di Figaro and Puccini's Suor Angelica. Baunoch has been invited to return for the company's next season in 2017.

Director of Choral Studies, **Ryan Beeken**, was very active during the 2014-2015 academic

year. He served as a guest conductor for eight festivals in Pennsylvania, Ohio, Iowa, and New York, and conducted the Louisiana All-State Men's Choir as well. In addition, Beeken presented invited sessions for the State Music Education Association Conferences in Pennsylvania, Ohio, and West Virginia and adjudicated for Music in the Parks and the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association. He also served as a guest artist for a three day residency at Ithaca College.

In December, 2014, Beeken, completed an eight-day residency at the University of Ljubljana Academy of Music in Ljubljana, Slovenia. Beeken taught two masterclasses to conducting students, focusing on both conducting gesture and rehearsal techniques. In addition, he gave lectures on basic conducting patterns, rehearsal planning, and Renaissance conducting strategies. Beeken also gave a detailed presentation on American Choral Music and Repertoire and dialogued with students from the Ljubljana Academy of Music regarding music study and choral music in the United States. Finally, Beeken rehearsed both the Chamber Choir and Women's Chorus, focusing on American choral music and style.

Zach Collins performed an invited recital at the Northeast Regional Tuba Euphonium Conference in Ithaca, NY on April 12, 2015. In addition to solo works, his recital also featured the Eastern Standard Trio.

Craig Denison's research poster "Transitions to Teacherhood: Reflections on Becoming Music Teachers" was presented to the Society of Music Teacher Education conference in Greensboro, N.C in September 2015.

At the International Trumpet Guild Conference held in Columbus, OH in May, 2015, **Kevin Eisensmith** conducted two works on the opening concert, organized and coordinated the annual Festival of Trumpets concert, and was featured soloist with the Wildcat Regiment Band, a Civil War reenactment band from Indiana, PA.

Heidi Lucas performed Claude T. Smith's "Three Contrasts for Horn and Band," Jack Stamp's "Concert Piece for Horn and Band," and James Ployhar's "Horns on the Run" with the Hollidaysburg Community Band, under the direction of Doug Stephens, in June 2015 at the First United Methodist Church in Hollidaysburg, PA. Lucas was also featured in a live appearance on WTAJ on the Central PA Live show, where she was interviewed about the performance with the band. She also performed a duet with her husband, Bruce Tychinski, on the show.

Dr. Carl Rahkonen, Music Librarian, served on the Program Committee for the national FinnFest USA, which took place in Buffalo, NY on October 9-11, 2015. He was responsible for 11 visiting music groups which came from Finland, Washington, Minnesota, Michigan and New York. FinnFest USA met in Buffalo at the invitation of the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra, since their home, Kleinhans Music Hall, turned 75 years old that week. It was designed by Finnish American architects Eliel and Eero Saarinen. The BPO also celebrated the 150th anniversary of the birth of Jean Sibelius with a series of concerts featuring Finnish Music.

Over the past year piano faculty Henry Wong Doe has had several international performances, in addition to his guest artist appearance at the West Virginia Music Teachers Association and a masterclass at Duguesne University. In March he performed alongside violinist Eugenia Choi in a performance and masterclass at The American University of Sharjah, United Arab Emirates. During the summer recess he gave three concerts in South Africa, including a solo recital in Pretoria, as well as two performances in New Zealand as invited soloist/guest artist with the Auckland Chamber Orchestra and Wallace New Zealand National Piano Competition. In August he performed a solo recital at the Esplanade Theatre in Singapore, and in October was one of four international pianists to perform at the Brussels Piano Festival in Brussels, Belgium.

IUP music faculty members Heidi Lucas and Zach Collins and Nazareth College faculty member, Jacob Ertl, formed the chamber ensemble Eastern Standard in Fall 2014. Eastern Standard performed recitals on the IUP campus, at Pennsylvania State University, and in eight high schools and middle schools on Long Island, N.Y in November 2014. In August 2015 they performed at the International Horn Symposium in Los Angleles. Eastern Standard's recital featured works by Anthony O'Toole, Frank Gulino, and Christopher Wiggins that were commissioned by the members of the ensemble as well as compositions by Gary Kulesha, James Stephenson, and Roger Kellaway. The ensemble plans to release a digital album in December 2015.

The HoodleBug Brass, the faculty brass quintet at IUP, performed a three-day recital tour to local high schools in May 2015. The quintet, comprised of Kevin Eisensmith, David Ferguson, Heidi Lucas, Christian Dickinson, and Zach Collins, performed for students at Indiana, Punxsutawney, Leechburg, Apollo Ridge, and Marion Center high schools.

IUP faculty members Timothy Paul, Heidi Lucas, and Rosemary Brumbelow, along with graduate student Brittan Braddock, participated in the 2015 International Fellowship for Conductors, Composers, and Collaborators (IFC3) held at the University of Oregon in June. Paul's vision for the event was to create a creative and supportive environment for conductors, composers, and performers to come together to make music and learn from each other and their shared experiences. During the week-long festival, the participants engaged in a rigorous schedule of daily rehearsals, recording sessions, academic lectures, and evening performances (which are open to the public). New conductors receive the opportunity to work with a professional group of performers, comprised of freelance musicians and collegiate professors from all over the United States.

The IUP Vocal Arts Area combined forces with the Altoona Symphony Orchestra and the Blair Concert Chorale to perform Beethoven's Symphony No. 9 on April 11, 2015. Nearly 200 members of the IUP community, including students, faculty, alumni, and community members, presented a stellar performance of the symphony to an audience of over 1,000 at Calvary Baptist Church in Altoona. IUP MUSIC IN RUSSIA

The IUP Faculty Woodwind Quintet and Brass Quintet (HoodleBug Brass) toured St. Petersburg and Moscow, Russia October 11-22, 2015. Their tour included concerts at the State Polytechnical Institute and Capella Hall in St. Petersburg and Rubenstein Hall in the Moscow Conservatory. The musicians also gave master classes at the Rimsky Korsakov Academy in St. Petersburg and the Moscow Conservatory. As part of their concert series, the two quintets performed Ice Breaker, a newly-commissioned work for combined woodwind and brass quintets, by composer Robert Litton. Additionally, the Woodwind Quintet performed "Vignettes" by IUP alumnus, Jim Self (BSEd 2965). The quintets were made up of Therese Wacker (flute), Stephanie Caulder (oboe), Rosemary Brumbelow (clarinet), Jason Worzbyt (bassoon), Heidi Lucas (horn), Jeff Wacker (horn), Kevin Eisensmith (trumpet), David Ferguson (trumpet), Christian Dickinson (trombone), and Zach Collins (tuba).



Library Notes



Professor James Dearing served as Director of Choral Studies at IUP from 1982 until his untimely passing in November 2010. left a great legacy through his teaching and inspiring hundreds of singers who sang for him in choral ensembles. But his legacy did not end with his teaching. He and his wife Kristi, also an IUP Music Faculty member, donated their large personal collection of books and scores to the Orendorff Music Library. It constitutes the largest single collection of materials ever donated to the Music Library, with more than three hundred books and thirteen hundred scores. We have been working the past three years cataloging this collection and it may take an additional three years to complete the job. Each item has a label that reads, "The James and Kristi Dearing Collection." The duplicates have been or will be given to music faculty and students, honoring the wishes of the donors.

Dearing was a graduate of the University of Wisconsin School of Music, where he studied with Otto-Werner Mueller and Robert Fountain. Before coming to IUP, he was assistant director of the 7th U.S. Army Soldiers Chorus and Director of Choral Studies at the University of Virginia, the University of Illinois at Chicago, and California Polytechnic State University. He performed as tenor soloist with the Roger Wagner Chorale touring throughout the former Soviet Union, the Far East, South America, Europe, and across North America under the auspices of the U.S. State Department and Sol Hurok Productions. He was also a frequent guest conductor and adjudicator for high school and collegiate choral festivals throughout North America.

In additional to his personal collection, Dearing was instrumental in obtaining the Edmund Najera collection of manuscript compositions, mostly of choral music, for our Music Library. The Ensemble Library in Cogswell Hall has also been named in honor of James C. Dearing.

Two IUP Percussion Alums have recently been elected to the Percussive Arts Society Board of Advisors: Dr. Brian West (MA 1994) and Jim Catalano (BSEd 1975). West served as the Graduate Assistant in Percussion at IUP from 1992-1994 and is currently Professor of Percussion & Coordinator of Percussion Studies in the School of Music at Texas Christian University. Catalano currently serves as the Percussion Business Manager for Ludwig-Musser Drums and Percussion.

IUP Music alumni Robert Read (BSEd 1980, MA 1990) and Jeremy Leidhecker (BSEd 2009) collaborated on the world premiere of Leidhecker's composition "Dear Stephanie" at Gateway High School in Monroeville, PA, on March 10, 2015. Read has served as the band director at Gateway High School for the past 33 years. Leidhecker did his student teaching with Read in 2009, and the two have shared a wonderful rapport and friendship ever since. Dr. Zembower's presentation is based on a research article that was just published in the Fall 2014 issue of the WASBE Journal on the same subject area and title as the presentations.
