
Finally, I want to thank you and tell you how much your gifts mean to us. Our administrators often remark on how active the music alumni are in providing financial support to the department

## Department Notes

The IUP Department of Music is happy to welcome Dr. Leonardo Perez to the faculty. Dr. Perez is Assistant Professor of Violin and Viola, and conducts the IUP Symphony Orchestra.

Under the direction of Dr. Ryan Beeken, the University Chorale is enjoying tremendous success. In April of 2017, they were one of a few university choirs selected to perform for the Eastern NAfME divisional conference in Atlantic City, NJ. This trajectory of

recognition will continue throughout the 2017-18 academic year. On March 8, 2018 Chorale will present a 75-minute lecturerecital entitled "Together We Sing" for the American Choral Director's Eastern Division Conference in Pittsburgh. In addition, Chorale will perform a 40-minute concert session for the PMEA State Conference at 10:00 am on Friday April 20, 2018 in Lancaster. Finally on June 18-26, 2018, IUP singers will embark upon an international tour to Prague and Vienna.

The complete library of music composed and arranged by IUP alumnus and former faculty member John Morris was recently donated to the IUP Jazz Bands library. Ralph Morris, brother of John, presented Kevin Eisensmith, director of the IUP Jazz Ensemble, with over 200 works composed and arranged by John Morris, who graduated from IUP in January 1966 and who taught at IUP from 1978 until his death in 1987. Morris was the founder of the Johnstown Jazz Workshop. Until recently, many of his works were not cataloged and were unavailable for study and performance. Through the efforts of Mike Bodolosky, Dick Gardenhour '69, and others, Morris's music for big band has been reassembled and donated to the IUP Department of Music.

Last May, IUP's Director of Bands, Dr. Timothy A. Paul, submitted live unedited recordings from the IUP Wind Ensemble's performances at the Pennsylvania Music Educators Conference in Erie, PA (April 21) and the Spring Concert in Fisher

their continued dedication to pursuing the highest level of musicianship and performance.


The IUP Faculty Woodwind Quintet (Therese Wacker, flute;

Stephanie Caulder, oboe; Rosemary Engelstad, clarinet; Heidi Lucas, horn; and Jason Worzbyt, bassoon) completed a tour of Williamsport and Scranton area schools on March 28-30, 2017. They performed and worked with students in nine sessions over their 2.5-day tour. Schools visited included Williamsport High School, Loyalsock Township High School, Lackawanna Trail High School, Montrose Area High School, and Mountain View Jr./Sr. High School.

IUP Department of Music faculty members, Heidi Lucas and Zach Collins, along with Nazareth College pianist Jacob Ertl toured Arizona on January 24-27, 2017. The horn, tuba, and piano trio, named Eastern Standard, performed at Arizona State University, University of Arizona, Phoenix College, and Rosie's House, an academy of music for underserved youth in Phoenix. Additionally, the ensemble performed at the Southwest Horn Workshop. In September, Eastern Standard completed a tour of universities in the state of Tennessee. Following a performance at IUP, they performed at Heinz Chapel (Pittsburgh), East Tennessee State University, Tennessee Tech University, University of Tennessee at Martin, Middle Tennessee State University, University of Tennessee at Knoxville, and Marshall University (West Virginia). The trio performed new compositions that the ensemble members have commissioned from composers across the globe. Two IUP faculty members, David Martynuik and professor emeritus Keith Young, had compositions performed on the tour.

A select group of nine students from the IUP Horn Choir, along with IUP horn professor Dr. Heidi Lucas, recently traveled to Hartford, Connecticut to attend and perform at the annual Northeast Horn Workshop. The horn choir presented five works by composers including Ingram, Taylor. Freshman horn

The performance was given under the direction of IUP Director of Choral Studies Ryan Beeken, with the combined forces of the IUP Choirs, soloists and a specially assembled orchestra of faculty and guest artists. They were joined by several collaborators from across the community and campus. As part of the concert, Craig Denison conducted the Chamber Singers in an excerpt from Benjamin Britten's Spring Symphony, with Maria Fenty Denison as a soloist.

On March 4, 2017, members of the IUP clarinet studio and clarinet professor Rosemary Engelstad hosted the inaugural Crimson SquawkFest, a clarinet-centric event for visiting community members, graduates, middle school students, and high school students. The day included a masterclass with Pittsburgh-based clarinetist Amanda Morrison and featured IUP students Catherine Kasun and Jenn Dibert. Engelstad led a session that focused on mindfulness and developing the kinesthetic sense for music performance. Participants rehearsed as a mass clarinet choir and performed a culminating recital at the end of the day. Engelstad, Amanda Morrison, David Martynuik, and Evan Engelstad presented a faculty recital for the guests.

The **IUP Flute Studio** will be hosting the Flute New Music Consortium's Flute Competition on Saturday, March 3rd, 2018.

Zach Collins and the IUP Tuba and Euphonium Studio hosted the third annual Tubaphonium Day on Sunday, March 19, 2017. Tuba, euphonium, and baritone players of all ages were invited to join the IUP Tuba and Euphonium Studio for a day of performance and learning. The musicians participated in master classes, heard a recital by Collins and guest euphonium soloist Ross Cohen, and performed as part of a mass tuba-euphonium ensemble. Tubaphonium Day culminated in a concert that featured Collins and Cohen as soloists as well as the IUP Tubaphonium Ensemble and a 50-piece, mass tuba-euphonium ensemble comprised of all participants at Tubaphonium Day. Participants included students from 21 different schools as well as adult musicians. 2018 Tubaphonium Day will be held on March 18, 2018.

Comprised of activities geared towards horn players of all ages and abilities, there's something for everyone! 43 participants and 22 pianos in DiCicco Hall. Later in the summer **Dr. Wong Doe** presented a workshop on Monster Piano Concert repertoire at the Pennsylvania Music Teacher's Conference at Lebanon Valley College, on June 9. IUP hosted the state-level MTNA competitions on November 5th, 2017 and will host the 2018 Annual Conference on June 8-10 2018.

The HoodleBug Brass, the faculty brass quintet in the IUP Department of Music, performed and taught at Easton Area High School on Saturday, December 10, 2016. The faculty members spent the day giving a mini-recital, master classes to brass instrumentalists, and rehearsing with the Easton Area High School Wind Ensemble. The day culminated with the HoodleBug Brass performing John Cheetham's Concertino for Brass Quintet and Concert Band with the EAHS Wind Ensemble in an evening concert.

The Litton Quartet, IUP's resident faculty quartet for six years, performed its final season during the 2016-2017 school year. The guartet featured Stanley and Swana Chepaitis, violins; Raul Fauré, viola; and Linda Jennings, cello. The quartet premiered new works by composers Stanley Chepaitis, Raymond Helble, Jack Stamp, Mike Barnett, and David Martynuik. They joined more experimental collaborations with jazz artists John Stowell and Nathan Santos, as well as performing a broad selection of the incredible literature for quartet, including works by Haydn, Mozart, Beethoven, Mendelssohn, Brahms, Dvorak, Smetana, Prokofiev, and Shostakovich. With the retirement of Dr. Stanley Chepaitis, a new faculty ensemble, the Litton Piano Trio, formed featuring Linda Jennings, cello, Sun Min Kim, piano and Leo Perez, violin. They performed their first concert in October 2017 featuring works by Haydn, Piazzolla, and Schoefield.

The **IUP String Project**, under the direction of Dr. Linda Jennings, continues its mission of providing quality string education for students in the area and mentoring future string educators. This year the IUP String Project begins a new partnership with the Chaing Rai Youth Orchestra (CYO) in northern Thailand. The CYO, led by Director Paramet Lerdkasem, is one of the leading

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string youth programs in Thailand. Plans are under way for the IUP String Project to host 4-5 CYO students on the IUP campus where they will participate in String Project and IUP String Area events in April 2018. The CYO will host IUP faculty, and hopefully IUP students, in the summer of 2018 to work with the CYO students in workshops and concerts.

### Faculty Notes

**Joseph Baunoch**, Associate Professor of Voice, was elected vice president of the Tri-States Chapter of the National Association of Teachers of Singing.

Director of Choral Studies, Dr. Ryan Beeken, had another busy year of scholarship, performance, and service! In addition to his on-campus engagements, Beeken conducted 7 festivals in Pennsylvania and New York. He also adjudicated for more than 11 choral festivals in Pennsylvania, Michigan, and New Jersey and served as a clinician for more than 20 schools across Pennsylvania and Maryland, Beeken was also invited to present sessions for 5 conferences, including the International Conference on Arts and Humanities in Hawaii and the National Conference for the National Association for Music Education in Grapevine, Texas. The IUP Chorale performed for the Eastern Division NAfME Conference in Atlantic City New Jersey; they were selected via a blind peer-reviewed process. Finally, Beeken was elected as the President-Elect for PMEA District 3.

**Craig Denison**'s chapter on "Boychoir Pedagogy" was published in April 2017 in the Oxford Handbook of Choral Pedagogy by Oxford University Press. The book was dedicated to the memory of Robert Page, long-time director of the Mendelssohn Choir of Pittsburgh, and features the writing of 25 other leading choral pedagogues.





In April 2017 Dr. Henry Wong Doe recorded his fourth commercial album, Pictures featuring the works of Modest Mussorgsky and a newly commissioned work "A zigzagged gaze" by New Zealand composer Eve de Castro-Robinson. The album was released on the New Zealand label Rattle Records on August 15th, 2017. Dr. Wong Doe was awarded sabbatical leave for this project, which included premiere performances of de Castro-Robinson's work in New York City (March 2017, Madison Avenue Presbyterian Church), Auckland, New Zealand (April 2017, University of Auckland) and London, United Kingdom (May 2017, St. Martin-in-the-Fields). The project was funded by a grant from Creative New Zealand (Arts Council of New Zealand) and the Wallace Arts Trust.

### Library Notes

"Music Librarian on Sabbatical" by Carl Rahkonen, Music Librarian

It is like the old joke: "Where did the librarian take his vacation? Why at the Library of Congress of course!" I have been on Sabbatical this fall and have been doing research on Finnish American musicians and that has meant going through lots of old archival materials, such as documents, music, and photographs. The work is similar to what I do each day in the Orendorff Music Library, except the topic is different. So far I have visited archives at Michigan State University, the University of Minnesota and at Finlandia University in Hancock, Michigan.

I am writing this currently from Turku, Finland, where I have been for two weeks studying materials at the Institute of Migration. It is a little counter intuitive to come to Finland to find out about Finnish American musicians, but there are Finnish scholars who have gathered more material and know more about the topic than we do. It has been a very rewarding and beneficial experience studying the materials of these musicians and I hope to be able to write something which honors them properly.

Having entered IUP as a music education major (trumpet, piano minor) in 1969,
