FACULTY STANDOUTS

Ben Ford (anthropology) participated in a workshop to scope a new National Science Foundation initiative to study **the impacts of coastal environmental variability and natural hazards on populated coastal regions**. The National Science Foundation invited approximately 400 researchers to participate in the workshops through a competitive nationwide application process.





Anthony and Jennifer Perillo (psychology) received a \$334,787 grant from the National Science Foundation to study **biases in opinions relating to the testimony of experts in forensic psychology cases**.
