Celebrating Achievement

IUP will honor Lt. Col. Barry D. Gasdek '64, a 2015 winner of the Distinguished Alumni Award, with the **Doctor of Public Service** honorary degree at its May 10 commencement ceremonies; 1,457 students have completed requirements for their academic degrees. IUP will hold three ceremonies to honor the graduates.



External Accolades Higher Access, Higher Earnings

IUP graduates are earning higher salaries than their peers, according to the Carnegie Foundation and the American Council on Education. IUP is the only member of Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education selected for the "Opportunity College and University-Higher Access, Higher Earnings" designation, which recognizes institutions with graduates who earn salaries that are 50 percent above (or more) than their peers in similar fields and that also provide access to students that reflect the communities that they serve. IUP is also the only university in Pennsylvania to hold the Carnegie Foundation's R2 ranking and the "Higher Access, Higher Earnings" designation, and one of only 19 public universities in the nation with the R2 classification and "Higher Access, Higher Earnings" designation.

Best Graduate Schools

IUP has been selected for U.S. News & World Report's Best Graduate Schools rankings, with IUP's graduate criminology program ranked in the top 34 programs in the nation. Editors also recognized IUP's graduate programs in education, English, speech-language pathology, fine arts, clinical psychology, and psychology. The Best Graduate Schools rankings in these areas are based on two types of data: expert opinion about program excellence and statistical indicators that measure the quality of a school's faculty, research, students, and post-graduate outcomes.

Proposed College Of Osteopathic Medicine Moving Forward

During the Western Pennsylvania Regional Rural Health Summit on April 16 hosted by IUP, President Michael Driscoll announced that an anonymous donor—who is a first-generation IUP graduate from Indiana County—has **gifted \$1 million to IUP** for its proposed college of osteopathic medicine.

Lt. Col. Barry Gasdek '64 gifted \$50,000 to the proposed college of osteopathic medicine. Gasdek has been a long-time supporter of a number of IUP initiatives, including supporting students who are veterans. His gift follows an announcement of a \$25,000 anonymous gift to the proposed college. IUP has secured more than \$32 million in private and government funding for the initiative. Once established, the college of osteopathic medicine is expected to generate \$79 million in annual regional economic impact.

On March 25, IUP and Torrance State Hospital formalized a clinical training affiliation agreement for students at IUP's proposed college of osteopathic medicine. Valerie Arkoosh, secretary of Pennsylvania's Department of Human Services, presented remarks during the event. The event celebrated IUP's 12th signed clinical training affiliation agreement.



President Driscoll and Miko Rose, founding dean of the proposed college of osteopathic medicine, were featured on Our Region's Business, a news show jointly produced by the Allegheny Conference and Pittsburgh's WPXI-TV. The segment is available on the Our Region's Business website.

The Center for Rural Pennsylvania is funding a statewide research study to determine the commonalities of physicians who commit to and stay in rural health care practice. The survey was developed by Rose and IUP's Applied Research Lab. The ARL will analyze the study.

IUP's Annual **Women in STEM Summit** featured keynote presenter Bonnie Anderson '80, a 2012 Distinguished Alumni Award winner, and 2023 honorary doctorate recipient and veteran diagnostics industry leader and cofounder, chairwoman, and CEO of PinkDX, Inc., an early-stage diagnostics company focused on addressing unmet medical needs for women. The Summit also featured the presentation of the Dr. Patricia Hilliard Robertson Memorial Scholarship for Outstanding Female Science Student Award to Anna Cutshall, a biology major and business administration minor.



Second Annual AI Summit

A total of 192 students, faculty, and staff attended the **second annual IUP AI Summit**, sponsored by the IUP Center for Scholarly Communication in IUP's Research and Innovation; 70 attendees earned digital badges for completing three or more sessions.

Supporting Students

Compliance Management International (CMI), a global provider of environmental, health, and safety services based in Lansdale, gifted \$15,000 in scholarships to students in IUP's Safety Sciences and Environmental Engineering programs. Students were selected by a committee from CMI based on a competitive application process. Scholarships ranged from \$5,000 (Leadership Scholarship) to \$2,500 (Health and Safety Scholarship and Environmental Studies Scholarship) and general scholarships of \$1,000.

Creating Healthcare Professions Pathways

IUP's Meigan Robb (Nursing) and Lei Hao (Allied and Public Health) secured \$808,454 in grant funding from the Pennsylvania Department of Education to enhance access to dual enrollment for qualified high school students. IUP's program will focus on creating initiatives for dual-enrollment students that support a clear pathway to high priority occupations in a health-related field.

Academy Of Culinary Arts Long-Range Plan Moving Forward

Work is underway to raze unoccupied buildings at six addresses on the 100 block of West Mahoning Street in downtown Punxsutawney, part of IUP's Academy of Culinary Arts long-range facilities plan. The demolition of these buildings will allow for the construction of a new educational and multipurpose culinary facility on West Mahoning Street adjacent to the Fairman Centre.

Accreditation Affirmed

IUP's Criminal Justice Training Center has received **Training Academy Accreditation** from the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc. The Center remains the first and only municipal police training center in Pennsylvania to achieve this designation.



Applied Research Lab Working With Altoona Curve

IUP's Applied Research Lab is **collaborating with the Altoona Curve** on a research project to analyze attendance rates for Altoona Curve baseball games.




Celebrating 150 Years

IUP will celebrate **150** years of excellence and impact during the 2025–26 academic year as it marks its sesquicentennial. IUP's "official" 150th birthday is May 17, 2025; the university (then Indiana Normal School) opened for its first 10-week term on May 17, 1875, with 80 students, which grew to 150 by the end of that first week. To fully involve students in the celebration, the sesquicentennial celebration will officially launch in August with the IUP Crimson Carnival on August 23; IUP's first day of classes for the fall semester is August 25. Kasha Stokes broke both the IUP and Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference all-time record in the 200 backstroke with a time of 1:58.70 at the NCAA DII Swimming Championships in March. By breaking her own record in the event by nearly six seconds, Stokes also earned All-American Honorable Mention laurels.

Gem Crittenden was named the **Most Outstanding Swimmer** at the PSAC Championships in February.
