IUP cut the ribbon for the University College facilities in the IUP Libraries on August 27. Angaziya Malenge, a member of the first cohort of explorers (formerly called undecided students) and sophomore sociology human services major from Pittsburgh, delivered remarks, along with University College Director Michele Norwood, President Michael Driscoll, and Provost Timothy Moerland. IUP welcomes more than 600 explorers this fall, including close to 200 returning students.

Nick Deardorff (geoscience) secured a \$425,829 National Science Foundation grant to purchase a Scanning Electron Microscope. The SEM is available to students and businesses in the region.



Thirty-four students participated in the 2019 Research Experience for Summer Scholars program, now in its fifth year. Distinguished Alumni Award recipient Dr. Douglas Kupas '86, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Emergency Medical Services medical director with positions at Geisinger Health System, presented the keynote address for the program.

Ben Ford and Bill Chadwick (anthropology) and 17 IUP students found evidence of life dating back 8,000 years at the Newport Village field school, located on the border of Westmoreland and Indiana counties. The discovery drew the attention of KDKA-TV and WESA-FM National Public Radio.

IUP received a \$200,000 Expansion Grant Award from the Pennsylvania Department of Education to continue work to reverse the decline in new-teacher graduation rates and to retain new teachers in the field. The funding builds upon a \$740,250 grant in 2018.

C. Edward Keller, a 2019 Distinguished Alumni Award recipient, has been honored by the Beaumont (Texas) Foundation of America by a \$60,000 gift to the C. Edward Keller Scholarship for Criminology and Criminal Justice at IUP.

MSA Safety, Inc., of Cranberry Township, donated equipment valued at \$36,500 to support IUP's Department of Safety Sciences' industrial hygiene and construction labs.

Mary Ann Dickey, of York County, gifted \$30,000 in memory of her late husband Jim Dickey '64, to support IUP nursing students.
