Clinical activities included assessment as well as individual, family, and group therapies. In this position, I served as lead therapist and coordinator of the Partial Hospitalization Program. Research activities include participation as a therapist for a grant funded project through the Clinical Trials Network to explore treatment efficacy of psychopharmacological and cognitive behavioral therapy interventions for adolescents diagnosed with co-occurring attention deficit hyperactivity disorders and substance use disorders. Additionally, duties include coordination of a research project exploring the use of contingency management strategies to improve treatment compliance in outpatient substance dependency programs.
