

The Mission of the IUP Research Institute is to advance the research agenda and educational objectives of Indiana University of Pennsylvania. The Research Institute provides a full range of pre-award and post-award services designed to provide "cradle-to-grave" support for IUP researchers. The Research Institute is governed by an independent Board of Directors which is responsible for upholding the Institute's Articles of Incorporation, By-Laws, and the principles set forth in the Affiliation Agreement with the University. The Board is composed of the University President, appointed University representatives, and local community and business leaders.


Indiana University of Pennsylvania and the IUP Research Institute jointly administer external funds. The IUP Research Institute is a 501c(3) (tax exempt) organization that operates independently for the benefit of Indiana University of Pennsylvania, under the terms of the Affiliation Agreement.

This Annual Report of Externally Sponsored Activities summarizes externally funded grants, contracts, and cooperative agreements for the year of July 1, 2013 – June 30, 2014 (Fiscal Year 2013-2014). This report is designed to recognize IUP faculty and staff members who dedicate their time, talents, and expertise to seek and receive external funds for their research, teaching, and creative activities. These accomplishments represent the outstanding commitment on the part of faculty and staff to advance the research, teaching, and public service missions of the University through external funding.

It is important to understand the type of data that are included (and not included) in this report. The data reported herein reflects the dollar amounts awarded (in aggregate and per project), not the dollar amounts expended. Many times, even with effective post-award management, activities actually performed differ from activities that were planned at the proposal stage. Said changes in activities often result in modifications to the budget and expenses incurred. When these changes occur the dollar amounts actually expensed can differ from the pre-award expectation. In the case of cost-reimbursable grants (large majority), the dollar amounts actually expensed and received by the institution could be less than what was awarded by the funding agency (at least in the time frame originally planned). In addition, the current database does not provide the ability to 'split' award dollars by co-investigator. Therefore, the department/unit of co-investigators does not receive recognition in this particular report. Alternate reports are available upon request. IT Services is working on a new and improved database that will greatly enhance functionality and help us more easily credit co-PIs with awards.


# **IUP Sponsored Activity Awards: 2-Year Comparison FY2012 - 2013 to FY2013 - 2014**



Congratulations to all of the IUP researchers for receiving sponsored activity dollars in the amount of **\$7,642,152** for Fiscal Year 2013-2014. The extensive efforts put forth in grantsmanship activities by IUP researchers made a fiscally challenging year extremely successful.

# Awards by Originating Funding Source Fiscal Year 2013-2014



IUP received 55% of its awards from the federal government (\$4,243,267) with US Department of Labor ranking as the top <u>federal</u> funder at \$1,879,800. The state of Pennsylvania came in second at \$1,675,416. The federal and state agencies, combined, accounted for nearly 78% of IUP's externally sponsored funding.


## **Increases over Fiscal Year 2012-2013 (Academic Colleges)**





# Awards by Academic College FY 2013-2014 to FY2012-2013





# Awards by Academic Department FY2013 – 2014 to FY 2012 - 2013





# College of Fine Arts Awards by Academic Department FY2013-2014 to FY2012-2013 Comparison





# College of Health & Human Services Awards by Academic Department FY2013-2014 to FY2012-2013 Comparison





# College of Humanities & Social Sciences Awards by Academic Department FY2013-2014 to FY2012-2103 Comparison





#### **Research Advocacy**

The IUP Research Institute staff actively work to promote, encourage, and facilitate grantsmanship at IUP in a myriad of ways. Individual and focused communication with researchers, chairpersons, deans, and administrators include, but are not limited to, the identification of funding opportunities, proposal development, budget development, pre-award authorization process, award/contract negotiations, post-award fiscal management, modifications, and project-closeout (including financial and technical reporting requirements throughout the life cycle of the award). We foster communication efforts to increase awareness, interest, and compliance.

Below are examples of efforts to increase interest, participation, understanding, and compliance in externally sponsored activities.

During the FY1314, Research Institute staff performed 126 customized searches for funding opportunities, and met with researchers and administrators 671 times. To maximize resources, IUP and the IUP Research Institute provide relevant tools for researchers. Utilizing SpinPLUS, researchers can perform their own customized funding searches and receive customized funding opportunities directly to their IUP email. The Research Institute website (http://www.iup.edu/researchinstitute) provides links to relevant policies, procedures, forms, agency links, and other useful tools.

Accurate and timely data is essential to managing the research portfolio at IUP. Deans and administrators continuously support, promote, and increase the sponsored activity within their academic purview. To assist with this task, the RI provides a variety of standard reports:

- ★ Monthly Deans' Report a quick view chart providing a cumulative summary of proposal and award activity trends. A comparison of the previous fiscal year totals to the current fiscal year (to-date) totals.
- Quarterly Deans' Report a more detailed report of the current fiscal year proposal and award activity including researcher name, agency, title of project, and dollar value of proposal and/or award.
- ❖ AWE report provides detailed information on grant-funded faculty releases, summer contracts, and graduate assistantships. The goal of this report is to assist IUP in managing postaward activities and, therefore, maximizing grant activity.
- Revolving Accounts Revolving Accounts are established by the RI when a PI has residual funds from a firm-fixed price contract (externally funded). The dollars are accounted for and available for use by the PI for "research-related" expenses. Reports are provided on a regular basis to deans and administrators.

#### **Educational Efforts**

The IUP Research Institute offers its "Nuts & Bolts" Workshop Series to faculty, staff and graduate students annually during the fall semester. These are held in the RI conference room by RI staff members. NOTE: Due to extremely low enrollment in FY1314, these same sessions will be migrated to an online platform for FY1415 allowing interested parties to access the workshops at their convenience! Face-to-face sessions will be provided upon request.

Focused, customized presentations at chairpersons' meetings, deans' meetings, faculty groups, graduate classes, and other interested parties are performed on an as-requested basis.

In addition to these four primary workshops, we host and/or participate in a wide variety of sponsored research activities for IUP faculty, staff, and administrators throughout the year. All events are offered free of charge to the IUP community.

#### **Proposal Strategies**

The RI works diligently to ensure proposals submitted on behalf of IUP are of the highest possible quality. Adhering to standard operating procedures helps to ensure the technical and budget narratives meet agency guidelines, meet applicable federal, state, and university pre-requisites, require reasonable university support, budget and scope of work are consistent, and have been appropriately reviewed, analyzed, and authorized by all IUP and IUPRI administrative entities.

When appropriate (and as time permits), the School of Graduate Studies and Research provides an indepth review/edit of proposal narratives to help ensure the highest possible quality. For "significant projects", professional external reviewers are utilized and paid for by the SGSR. These efforts have greatly improved the quality of our proposals and the grant-writing expertise of our researchers. It is fully expected that we will see a long- term return on investment as these researchers continue to grow and succeed in grantsmanship activities.

#### **Researcher Incentives**

In addition to our outreach initiatives, the RI partners with IUP and the School of Graduate Studies and Research to recognize researcher participation at both the pre-award and post-award stages. The President's Advancing Grantsmanship initiative was established in 2010 to encourage faculty to write and submit proposals. Recipients of the President's Advancing Grantsmanship incentive continues assist faculty members. Forty-one different faculty members received this incentive for FY 2013-2014. The School of Graduate Studies and Research manages this initiative on behalf of the President's Office.

### **Compliance Efforts**

Staying up-to-date with federal, state, and other agency compliance requirements for sponsored activities is one of the most important responsibilities of the RI. To assist IUP in this function, the RI requires staff to participate in at least one professional organization conference per year. Partnering with the SGSR, the RI assisted in establishing standard operating procedures in areas such as technology transfer, research misconduct, intellectual property, and other related areas.

#### **Award Implementation**

To promote post-award success, upon award receipt, the RI facilitates a "kick-off" meeting with the primary investigator to discuss and review the mechanics of how to efficiently execute the scope of work. Compliance to federal, state, and university policies and regulations are emphasized. These meetings include members from administration, grants accounting, purchasing, human resources, and any other division pertinent to successful outcomes. These "kick-off" meetings assist the researcher in understanding basic requirements such as purchasing equipment, contracting with a grant-funded graduate assistant, and processing their summer contracts or academic year releases.
