



Position Title: Associate Professor, Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) Program

Position Description:

The Department of Counselor Education and Human Services is searching for a tenured associate professor to develop a new Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) master's program. The new program is projected to accept its first class of students in Fall, 2019. The University of Dayton (UD) has partnered with 2U, a nationally prominent online education provider, to power and support our online programs. This partnership provides the department with a greatly enhanced online infrastructure to create a seamless student experience and significantly extend the scope and reach of our graduate programs. The department and university offer a highly collaborative, interdisciplinary environment.

This nine-month tenured position is offered at the rank of associate professor. The successful candidate will: 1) teach a variety of online courses in applied behavior analysis; 2) develop and coordinate the ABA program; 3) actively maintain a scholarly research agenda including publications and presentations; 4) actively serve at the department, school, university, community, state, and national professional levels; and 5) engage with faculty and students in a manner that highlights professionalism. Online course production logistics with 2U will require some travel to their facilities. Candidates who exhibit a commitment to diversity and equity through their teaching, scholarship, and service are encouraged to apply.

Required Qualifications:

- Doctorate from an accredited university in applied behavior analysis or related discipline (e.g., school psychology, special education, human development) with specific training in ABA;
- BCBA certification;
- Broad training in behavior analysis (applied, conceptual and experimental) and expertise in a specific area of applied behavior analysis.
- Working knowledge of BACB rules and regulations for verified course sequence (VCS) and certification;
- Working knowledge of ABAI program accreditation standards;
- Active membership in professional organizations related to ABA;
- Demonstrable record of successful graduate-level university teaching experience;
- Demonstrable record of success of publishing and scholarship in ABA and/or related fields (listed above);
- Experience employing diverse pedagogies in a learner-centered environment;
- Excellent written communication skills
