## **REPORTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS**

### **President's Report**

- A revised website for the Strategic Plan and Goals is coming soon.
- For the first time in 11 years, total IUP head count has increased by 4.78% (415 additional students).
  - There is a total of 9,254 students.
  - New student enrollment is up by 16 percent.
  - Graduate student enrollment is up by 2 percent.
  - International student enrollment is up by 23 percent.
- Chancellor Greenstein is visiting on October 4 from 2:15 to 3:30 pm in Gorell Hall.
- Homecoming week is coming up and includes the following:
  - Women's Soccer v Gannon on Wednesday at 4 pm.
  - The Alumni Association Board is meeting on Friday and there are numerous alumni-focused events.
  - The parade is on Saturday at 10 am.
  - Crimson Huddle at the KCAC starts at 11 am and continues until the start of the football game.
  - Coal Bowl vs. California at 2 pm on Saturday.
  - Field Hockey vs. Bloomsburg at 7 pm on Saturday.
  - Late night game night at Folger on Saturday.

There are several activities for students and social media and other campaigns to remind everyone to be safe.

#### **Provost's Report**

Good afternoon,

IUP was awarded a Title III grant to support our student success work. Amber Racchini and Paula Stossel are Co-PIs for this \$2.1 million grant to be implemented over the course of five years. It is wonderful to see this come to fruition. Congratulations to Amber and Paula.

We are launching a review of our academic program array and academic restructuring. These are parallel initiatives. The program review involves looking at a subset of our programs based on an analysis of several metrics to identify undergraduate and graduate programs with lower enrollments. We are partnering with Institutional Research to prepare a packet to be sent to the programs next week. They are to engage in a self-study, which takes place through November 17, resulting in one of the following recommendations:

- Continue with no action;
- Continue with curricular modification;
- Report ways to share courses or programs within IUP;
- Report ways to share courses across PASSHE;
- Discontinue programs, but keep or develop service mission; or
- Discontinue program.

This recommendation will be completed with engagement with the department chair and the dean. The recommendations will move on to a review within Academic Affairs Council, joined by two APSCUF representatives and the co-chairs of the university-wide curriculum committees. The recommendation will then move forward to President's Cabinet for final decisions.

At the same time, the academic restructuring will take place. Two proposed structures were developed after examining multiple data points.

Next week, there will be two open for scheduled for folks to engage in this initiative, ask questions, and provide comments. The open for are scheduled on

Wednesday, October 11 at 4:00 p.m. Thursday, October 12 from 11:10 to 12:20 p.m.

A campus-wide communication with the details will be sent by the end of the week. Between October 18 and November 1, there will be an open comment period. By early November, we will have a final academic structure. If you have any questions, I will be happy to answer them.

Question from a faculty member: Coming to campus is not the same. What is the university doing to gauge the on-campus morale.

Answer:

We have been having conversations about this. Part of the morale challenge is that we are trying to keep pace with declining budgets and enrollment. Our previous academic restructuring did not get us where we need to be. This is work that we need to do. Please continue to stay on board and work together with us. The way to move beyond this is to complete the work that needs to be done to ensure a sustainable curriculum and program array.

### Grow with Google Professional Certificates

## **Grow with Google – Google Professional Certificates**

The PA State System of Higher Education negotiated an agreement with Google to receive free seats in Grow with Google. These certificates are hosted on the Coursera website. Each university received an allocation of 100 licenses and was asked to prioritize how they would be used.

IUP initially plans to use the Grow with Google Licenses in three ways:

- They will be used as part of an educational support initiative to employees at a local power plant looking to gain new skills in the wake of the plant's closure.
- In collaboration with IUP's Student Government Association, the certificates will be offered and promoted to students as part of the SGA academic initiatives.
- The university will also run a pilot program of having the certificates as value added alongside credit-bearing courses.

The 100 licenses are revolving seats meaning when a person completes the program then another person can be registered for that seat/license.

Richard Muth has detailed information that is especially valuable for faculty wanting to understand more about the curriculum and learning outcomes of each module within each certificate.

Important notes:

- These are certificates and not certifications.
- Certificates are available in cybersecurity, data analytics, digital marketing and ecommerce, IT Support, project management and user experience (UX) design.
- The roll out could not occur until after the official statewide announcement on August 29.
- These free licenses/seats allocated to SSHE universities are only for 2023-2024.
