I. Call to Order

III. Co-Chairs Report:

IV. Liberal Studies Committee Report

- a. 11-03-11 and 11-10-11 Minutes are on the X-drive.
- b. An update on assessment of LS courses was provided. On a Boser/Deckert motion the committee voted to modify section 2a of the UWUCC Handbook as described in the Liberal Studies Minutes.

V. Items for Review/Possible Action:

- a. 11-43 CHHS Moratorium Response: B.S. Physical Education and Sport-Aquatics, BS Physical Education & Sport-Athletic Training, B.S. Athletic Training, BS Nursing/Licensed Practical Nurse Track, BS Nursing/Registered Nurse Track

1. Jose Rivera and Elaine Blair spoke about the following 3 programs which are in danger of being placed in moratorium.

- B.S. Physical Education and Sport-Aquatic. The aquatics program will be converted to a minor. The following Migyanka/Fair motion was approved: Based on the evidence provided to the committee the UWUCC recommends the program be placed in moratorium.
- B.S. Physical Education and Sport-Athletic Training. The program is an old designation and does not enroll any students. The following Knight/Greenawalt motion was approved: Based on the evidence provided to the committee the UWUCC recommends the program be placed in moratorium.
- B.S. Athletic Training. Overall enrollments have averaged over 100 students. Accreditation guidelines state students must meet certain criteria to advance through the program. This results in some students not meeting the criteria and thus not graduating in the major. However, once students meet the criteria there is a very high retention rate to graduation. In addition, students who don't meet the criteria do not tend to leave IUP but change to other majors. IUP students score far above the national average on the national certification exam for athletic training.

The following Deckert/Tickell motion was approved: Based on the evidence provided to the committee the UWUCC recommends the B.S. in Athletic Training **not** be placed in moratorium.

2. BS Nursing/Licensed Practical Nurse Track, BS Nursing/Registered Nurse Track
 - The following Boser/Fair motion was approved: Based on the evidence provided to the committee the UWUCC recommends the BS Nursing/Licensed Practical Nurse Track **not** be placed in moratorium. Greenawalt abstained.
 - The following Boser/Potts motion was approved: Based on the evidence provided to the committee the UWUCC recommends the BS Nursing/Registered Nurse Track be placed in moratorium. Greenawalt abstained.
