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Rationale for Proposed Changes							
<b>(A) Why is the program being revised?*</b>	<p>In October 2016 the BOG amended Policy 1993-01-A to state that Liberal Studies credits should be minimum 40 and maximum 48. As recommended by the IUP Director of Liberal Studies, we are moving three credits from the Liberal Studies Electives category and placing them in the Free Electives category.
