Bachelor of Arts in Art, Art History track (Concentration in Art History)

The mission of the BA in Art/Art History Degree is to provide art history majors with a solid foundation in the history of art, from ancient through modern times. The degree prepares students for graduate study leading to careers in museums, galleries, fine arts libraries, visual resources, teaching, and research. Specific goals, objectives and competencies related to this degree include the acquisition and demonstration of critical thinking, research and writing skills; knowledge of terminology, methodology, and competency with various approaches to art historical inquiry, and the ability to conduct art history research through independent investigations.

The following new course proposals and revisions in existing courses are to be included in the revised program:

- ARHI 100 Arts of the 20th Century, 3 cr. Change of Preface only, from ART to ARHI. Proposal attached.
- ARHI 207 Renaissance to Modern, 3 cr. A new course which combines the old ARHI 206 (Renaissance to Baroque) and ARHI 211 (Modern Art), making the introductory survey of Western art two courses, rather than the previous three. Proposal attached.
- ARHI 224 Introduction to Asian Art, 3 cr. New lower level course to be added to the Art History Foundation, expanding the scope of fundamental surveys of art to include non-Western traditions. Proposal attached.
- ARHI 410 19th Century European Painting, 3 cr. New upper level course to be added to the Art History major, controlled electives. Proposal attached.
- ARHI 411 20th Century European Art, 3 cr. New upper level course to be added to the Art History major, controlled electives. Proposal attached.

Part II. 3. Rationale for Change.

- a. A primary reason for the changes are to bring our program in compliance with the 120 maximum credits required by the BOG.
- b. Another primary reason for the requested revisions is to bring our program into compliance with the guidelines for accreditation by the National Association of Schools of Art and Design (NASAD). To this end, the following steps have been taken:
 - 1). The 12 credit requirement for 4 semesters in a foreign language has been added, as required by NASAD.
 - 2). The number of required Art and Art History courses will more closely correspond with similar programs at other major institutions.
 - 3). More upper division offerings have been added to facilitate students' completion of the requisite number of courses in four years of academic endeavor.
 - 4). The added courses exploit the area specialties of current Art History faculty, as suggested by NASAD.

Part III. Implementation. Provide answers to the following questions:

1. How will the proposed revision affect students already in the existing program?

Students currently enrolled will have the option of continuing under the old program, or opting for admission into the new.

2. Are faculty resources adequate?

Yes. Recent additions to the Art History faculty are adequate to staff these positions. Furthermore, the proposed classes, (many of which have been offered in the past as "Special Topics") will enable faculty to teach within their particular areas of expertise, to the satisfaction of both faculty and students.

3. Are other resources adequate?

Yes, the department has sufficient class rooms and equipment to permit these offerings.

4. Do you expect an increase or decrease in the number of students as a result of these revisions?

This is difficult to predict. The reduction in the Liberal Studies component of University requirements could reduce the enrollment in Art History classes that satisfy that requirement. This particularly applies to those courses which satisfied Liberal Studies electives (ARHI 205, 206, and 211 in the old program; ARHI 205 and 207 in the revised program). On the other hand, several of the newly proposed courses are proposed as Liberal Studies Electives. Since they are more varied in content and reflect current interests, the new courses offerings will attract students outside the discipline taking Free Electives. Within the Department, it is expected that the expanded offerings will attract more Art majors from all divisions, and ultimately increase the number of students electing the Art History tract.

Part IV. Periodic Assessment

Departments are responsible for an ongoing review of curriculum. Include information about the department's plan for program evaluation:

- 1. As part of NASAD accreditation requirements, the programs and curricula of all divisions of the Art Department will be reviewed by a representative of the accrediting body every five years. Current NASAD requirements are outlined in the NASAD Handbook. As these change, the various programs offered by the Department will be brought into compliance.
- 2. In addition, the Art History Faculty will review the course offerings annually to assess the course offerings and make changes.
 - 3. Changes will be made based on a number of criteria, including the following:
 - a. Student enrollment in current offerings
 - b. Changing research interest of faculty
 - c. Changes implemented by other departments in related fields
