Part II. Description of Curriculum Change

1. Catalog Description:

BIOL 310 Applied Entomology and Zoonoses 2c-3l-3cr

Prerequisite: BIOL 220 or permission

A study of the measures for abatement or control of arthropods, rodents, birds, and other disease vectors of public importance; selection, chemistry, formulation, and safe application of insecticides, rodenticides, and fumigants; pesticiding equipment; application of biological and other measures of control.

2. Proposed Changes:

BIOL 310 Applied Entomology and Zoonoses 2c-3l-3cr

Prerequisite BIOL 201 or BIOL 112; BIOL 220; or instructor permission

A study of the measures for abatement or control of arthropods, rodents, birds, and other disease vectors of public importance; selection, chemistry, formulation, and safe application of insecticides, rodenticides, and fumigants; pesticiding equipment; application of biological and other measures of control.

3. Justification/rationale for the changes:

The Biology Department adopted a new curriculum in Fall 2014. BIOL 201 replaces BIOL 112 as a prerequisite for BIOL 220. Students in the BIOL majors will typically sequentially complete BIOL 201, BIOL 202 and BIOL 203. However, students who completed BIOL 201 are not able to enroll in BIOL 310 because of the current prerequisites.
