Program Revision Proposal

Part II Description of Curriculum Change

1. Catalog Description:

Completion of the sequence of courses in Education of Deaf and Hard of Hearing Persons (EDHH) leads to a Bachelor of Science degree in Education and Pennsylvania Department of Education certification as a "Teacher of the Hearing Impaired, K-12." Students are provided with the basic skills to teach in special classes for hard-of-hearing or deaf individuals.

Students enrolled in this sequence of study are prepared to assume positions as itinerant hearing therapists and classroom teachers for individuals ranging from preschoolers to adults. Work settings may include public schools, continuing education programs, and home training situations.

Observations, clinical experience, and practicum are required prior to placement in a school environment for the student teaching experience. The student will complete the following 50 hours of observation through enrollment in EDUC 242.

- A. 25 hours of observation of itinerant and self-contained classrooms for the hearing impaired.
- B. 10 hours of observation in regular education classrooms.
- C. 10 hours of observation in special education classrooms.
- D. 5 hours of observation in a noneducational setting.

The student will complete 30 hours of individual clinical experience through enrollment in EDHH 329 and 330 and 35 hours of school-based practicum through enrollment in EDUC 342.

3. Rationale for Changes

Program Name Change:

Education of deaf and hard of hearing persons is a constantly changing field. One of the most important changes that occur with regularity is the 'politically correct' name of this group of individuals. The current practice is to identify persons who have hearing loss as Deaf or Hard of Hearing. It is important for the IUP program to reflect this change <u>out of respect</u> for deaf and hard of hearing individuals as well as to be considered current professionally in the field. **Education of Deaf and Hard of Hearing Persons (EDHH)** is currently a more appropriate title for the program.

Course Deletion:

The SPLP 242 Speech Science course was deleted from the list of required major EDHH courses because the advanced nature of the information provided in this course is not appropriate for EDHH majors. The elements of speech science that are important for EDHH students are already presented in the EDHH 307 Teaching Speech to Deaf/Hard of Hearing Persons course.

Course Additions:

One of the major perceived weaknesses of the current program is the relatively low number of Sign Language Courses offered. To enhance and improve the sign language skills of the program graduates, it is important for them to use American Sign Language every semester that they are enrolled in the program. To accomplish this, three new 1-credit sign language classes were added to the curriculum. EDHH 216 Intermediate ASL II, EDHH 315 Manually Coded English, and EDHH 316 Interpreting for Teachers will provide the EDHH student with the opportunity to use sign language skills an additional three semesters over their course of study. These classes provide a significant amount of additional practice in the receptive understanding and expressive use of both American Sign Language and English-based sign language systems.

Another weakness noted by alumni and faculty was the heavy concentration of material that needed to be covered in a single 3-credit General Methods course. To alleviate this problem and to provide the time and opportunity for more thorough coverage and application of the required materials, the EDHH 360 course was reduced to 2-credits and a 2-credit EDHH 361 General Methodology for Teaching Deaf/Hard of Hearing Persons II course was added to the curriculum. This enables the students to have a more in-depth exposure to each of the content areas of instruction as well as expanded opportunities to apply all of the strategies learned in class.

Number Changes:

The numbers of two courses which are taken during the students senior year of work were changed from 300-level to 400-level courses to more appropriately reflect the instructional level. **EDHL 351 was changed to EDHH 451 and EDHL 365 was changed to EDHH 465.**

The current sign language courses were renumbered to reflect the sequence and year in which they are taken. EDHL 244 was changed to EDHH 215, EDHL 331 was changed to EDHH 415.

Course Name Changes:

For all of the reasons noted above in the Program Name Change section, the use of the term "Deaf/Hard of Hearing" is also more appropriate in the title of each course. All courses that previously had "Persons with Hearing Loss" in the title were changed to "Deaf/Hard of Hearing Persons".

The EDHL program has a two-semester instructional practicum in addition to those required in the College of Education Core. This practicum was called 'Hearing Clinic I and II" because it was held in the University's Speech and Hearing Clinic. This course is now taken on-site at the Western Pennsylvania School for the Deaf. In addition, the purpose of the class has always been to provide first-time teaching and collaboration opportunities with deaf students and the faculty who teach them. The name of this course sequence was changed from EDHL 329-330 Hearing Clinic I and II to EDHH 329-330 Teaching-Collaborative Practicum I and II because it more clearly reflects the course content and purpose.

The name of the EDHL 331 Advanced Sign Language course was changed to EDHH 415 ASL Pedagogy because it more clearly reflects the content of the course.

Prerequisite Changes:

The Pennsylvania Department of Education mandates that all students in teacher preparation programs maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0 overall and in their major. All prerequisites were changed to reflect this requirement.

Specific course prerequisites were modified to reflect the new sequence of sign language and general methods courses.

III. Implementation

- 1. Students already enrolled who are junior and senior level will have the option to take any of the new classes, but will not be required to do so. Sophomores will be required to take all of the new courses.
- 2. There are three full time faculty in the EDHL program. There is adequate faculty load available to accommodate these curriculum modifications. Sign language courses that were offered during multiple semesters will now be offered in sequence only. There is adequate space available for all of the sign language courses. The second methods course will utilize space previously used for a separate section of Speech Science. There are adequate seats available for all of the identified modifications.
- 3. The classrooms utilized for instruction are all adequately supplied with the instructional technology necessary for appropriate instruction. There are no expenses anticipated with the change in curriculum that have not already been accommodated.
- 4. We expect an increase in enrollment as a result of these changes. There is currently no need for adjustment. The maximum seating for each class is currently 25 and we do not anticipate an increase that will put that number in jeopardy. Current enrollment in the EDHL major is approximately 50 students. This major has accommodated up to 115 students in the past, so there is every reason to believe that an increase in enrollment can be easily accommodated.

IV. Periodic Assessment

The faculty of the EDHL/EDHH program routinely reevaluates all course offerings on a regular basis. This is done through curriculum committee meetings at the end of each semester. Student comments are solicited in addition to regular student evaluations for each course and reviewed at these meetings. Input is also requested from various field-based sites and incorporated into the curricular review process. In addition, the EDHH program is in the process of being accredited by the learned society, the Council on Education of the Deaf (CED) which conducts 5 year and 10 year program reaccredidation reviews.



This letter is written in support of the curriculum revisions proposed by the Education of Persons with Hearing Loss Program. The proposal clearly outlines the revisions necessary for the program to meet the requirements for accreditation by the Council for the Education of the Deaf (CED). The revisions, as contained in the curriculum proposal, will not create resource problems for the Department of Special Education and Clinical Services.
