b. list of all associated course changes

There are no course changes to accompany this program revision. The revision is designed to meet the requirements of the revised Liberal Studies program. With the reduction of Liberal Studies credits, those credits are shifted to the major and to the free elective category for the BS in Communications Media. In the major students will continue to take the same required courses as currently outlined in the undergraduate catalog but will have an additional three credits of Controlled Electives in the major. * The range of Controlled Electives in the major changes from 13-19 credits to 16-21 credits, changing the overall major requirement from 42 credits to 45 credits. The additional credits shifted from Liberal Studies will be added to the free elective category as needed, changing the free electives from 6 credits to a range of 7-8 credits.

3. Rationale for the change

- a. Based on revisions in the Liberal Studies section of the curriculum
- b. The change of major credits provides structure for the students' curriculum while still allowing them significant freedom of choice in Out of Department Electives and Free Electives.

Students enrolled in the program prior to August 2012 will remain under the current curriculum in the undergraduate catalog, 2011-12. Students entering in August 2012 or later will be required to follow the proposed revision. Students enrolled in the program in the semesters of the curriculum transition will be permitted to follow the requirements of either curriculum.

2. Are faculty resources adequate?

The current faculty resources are adequate to handle the proposed revisions.

3. Are other resources adequate?

Yes. Facilities, equipment and classroom space are adequate.

4. Do you expect an increase or decrease in the number of students as a result of these revisions?

No. Substantial enrollment changes are not anticipated.
