IV. DESCRIPTION OF CURRICULUM CHANGE

Old Requirement -

Minor:

15 sh

Required courses:

CO 220 - Applied Computer Programming	3 sh (1)
Other CO electives	12 sh (2)

- (1) Appropriate background may be CO 101, IM 241, or other competence determined by department.
- (2) CO 101 (formerly CO 200 Introduction to Computers) is an appropriate entry course for minors or for students who wish to take only one course.

New Requirement -

Minor:

The minor in Computer Science consists of a minimum of 15 credits in Computer Science courses including at most 6 credits in courses numbered CO 205 or lower.

Rationale for the Change:

- (1) We removed CO 220 as a requirement because the Computer Science Department no longer feels that it is essential for every minor to include CO 220. In our discussion of this issue, we specifically mentioned Mathematics and Geography majors who minor in Computer Science.
- (2) We added phrasing which assures that a minor includes adequate advanced course work.
- (3) The notes on CO 101 do not appear to be necessary.
