Part II. Description of the Curriculum Change

1. Course to be deleted

CRIM 416: Criminal Justice Personnel and Supervision (3c-01-3sh) will be deleted. The undergraduate catalog description of this course is as follows: A study of public personnel systems with specific application to criminal justice agencies. The role and function of supervision as a concept of a comprehensive personnel system as well as the relationship between agency personnel and the impact on crime will be examined.

2. Justification/Rationale:

This course, which is currently offered as an elective, is being deleted because of the changing needs of the discipline of criminology. Over the past 15 years, this discipline has evolved from one that was more applied in nature and emphasized knowledge of the skills necessary to work in the criminal justice system, to its current form that focuses on theory, research, and critical thinking about a variety of issues relevant to crime and criminal justice (these specific issues can be identified in the proposed curriculum). CRIM 416 will be replaced with CRIM 205: Law Enforcement and the Community, CRIM 215: Courts and the Criminal Justice System, and CRIM 225: Survey of Corrections (see Appendix C). These new courses will be controlled electives that students may select from a group of courses that focus on the criminal justice system, and each will allow students to examine issues pertaining to personnel and supervision in various professions.

3. Impact:

Deletion of CRIM 416 will not affect any other existing criminology courses or programs offered at IUP. Because this course is an elective, students also will not be affected, as a new set of electives is offered in the proposed curriculum (including the three courses mentioned above).
