## Part II. Description of the Curriculum Change

#### 1. Course to be deleted:

CRIM 291: Theory and Techniques of Interviewing (3c-01-3sh) will be deleted. The undergraduate catalog description of this course is as follows: Consideration of the theory, nature, methods, and principles of interviewing.

#### 2. Justification/Rationale:

This course, which is currently offered as an elective, is being deleted because of the changing needs of the discipline of criminology. Over the past 15 years, this discipline has evolved from one that was more applied in nature and emphasized knowledge of the skills necessary to work in the criminal justice system, to its current form that focuses on theory, research, and critical thinking about a variety of issues relevant to crime and criminal justice (these specific issues can be identified in the proposed curriculum).

## 3. Impact:

Deletion of CRIM 291 will not affect any other existing criminology courses or programs offered at IUP. Because this course is an elective, students also will not be affected, as a new set of electives is offered in the proposed curriculum.
