Proposed Change:

Replace the current Special Education Competency Requirement examination option with a specific 2 credit course, EX 301 Education of Students with Disabilities in Inclusive Secondary Programs

Comparison of Old and New Program:

This change will add 2 credits to the professional education sequence and will reduce the free electives from 0-5 to 0-3.

Rationale:

This change is requested to provide the appropriate and necessary education for teacher education teachers who will teach Economics to students with disabilities in inclusive secondary settings. It replaces an examination option to fulfill the special education competency requirement. The examination provided no instruction in the indicated field.
